CVCA seeks \$6,000

The Credit Valley Conservation Authority has announced its 1981 financial requirements needed to fund Credit River projects which benefit certain municipalities. Halton Hills has been asked to pay \$6,000 as its estimated share for work on the Glen Williams cometery, Regan Cresent (Georgetown) erosion control and construction along Metcalfe Court ravine. Kennel regulations

Town council has beefed up Halton Hills' kennel regulations, passing a new bylaw concerning such businesses Monday night. According to the new legislation, no kennels will be allowed within 100 feet of the nearest property line, nor will kennels be attached to houses. Instead they must be enclosed in a separate building. The bylaw sets down some basic health regulations for the animal compound, including drainage, ventilation and space. Four-foot high fences are required for kennels located within 200 feet of property lines.

Although some councillors felt the levy should rise only enough to match Canada's 11 to 12 per cent inflation rate, Mr. Perlin explained that the 15 per cent figure would allow the region to "catch up" on badly needed services.

If the regional departments find they can work with the cut, residents in the three southernmost municipalities will save around \$2,720,000 from the levy increase which, as proposed in the 1981 budget, would rise as much as 30 per
