

## Georgetown Gemini Tier Two?

The Georgetown Junior B Gemini issued a statement after their executive meeting last Wednesday which concerns the possibility of competition in a higher calibre league.

Club secretary Blayne Hillcock released the following statement: "It is expected that the Georgetown Junior hockey club will continue operation under the present format. However, the realm of possibility does exist for

the application of an entry into Tier Two Junior A. Further discussions will continue and be announced at the team general meeting to be held March 18, 1981."

After the executive meeting last Wednesday general manager Bob Tost said that if the club is able to come up with a good sponsor and the waiver-import rule is changed then concrete possibilities exist.

Tost said that by spending more on the club the team

will eventually make additional funds. Many new ideas were tossed around at last week's meeting concerning fund-raising for the team that will perhaps be tried next year Tost said.

But until a new executive is elected next March 18 there is little the present executive can do on a permanent basis, Tost said. He said that the executive have not been idle since the Gemini finished their season two weeks ago.

## Minor Atoms in tie series

Game two between the Al Pluitt Minor Atoms and the Fort Erie squad featured everything you would want to see in a hockey game and a lot that you wouldn't.

On the good side, it was a solid team effort by the locals in this 5-2 win over the fast skating hard-checking visitors. Sean Cotton provided very sharp goaltending and a tough defensive effort came from Adam Bennett, John Brooker, Kevin Roe and Chris Stoddart. Four short-handed goals - 2 by each team - added a great deal of excitement.

On the other side, there was inconsistent refereeing and a total of 12 penalties assessed in the game. Seven were called on the visitors and five went to the Georgetown contingent. There were several overly aggressive plays and many examples of poor sportsmanship by a few of the visiting fans.

Georgetown netted two short-handed markers at 6:52 and 6:05 of the opening period. Travis Gardiner connected on the first and Andrew Hoddinott tallied for the second. Jason Knight scored at 4:47 to end the period 3-0.

Early in the second, Fort Erie made it 3-1 on a short-handed goal. Late in the third, Andrew Hoddinott scored a powerplay marker at 2:28 but at 2:11 Fort Erie stormed back with their second short-handed effort. The visitors lifted their netminder late in the game and pressed hard but were not successful. At 1:07 Adam Bennett rifled a shot into the empty net to end the game 5-2.

In game three Saturday night in Georgetown, the visiting Fort Erie team came out determined not to be eliminated from the series and went on to defeat the locals 5-3.

Fort Erie resumed the scoring in the third period with a powerplay marker at 8:56 and a goal at 6:58. Georgetown replied with two penalty tallies of their own at 5:44 by Andrew Hoddinott and at 1:01 by Brent Presswood, but were unable to find the range again. The visitors were able to move the puck quite well and played well defensively. Georgetown had some excellent scoring opportunities but could not connect on them.
