

Boosting teen category

Fair Board seeks youthful talent

If you are a teenager and have a skill in art or crafts of

some sort, then the Georgetown Fair Board is hoping to hear from you this year at fair time.
In recent years, the Board

has been disappointed by the lack of teenage interest in exhibiting their talents in the Town and Country division of the fair. By asking for the co-operation of the Home Economics and Shop teachers at elementary schools and the local high school, the Agricultural Society executive is hoping to attract more entries from teenagers 11 to 18 years of age. Work done in classes at the schools is eligible for entry in one of the competitions at the fair.

In the Town and Country division, there are categories for work done by teenagers in sewing, fancy work, baking, preserves, and woodcraft, as well as flowers.

Teenagers are not limited to

one division, however, and are advised that they can enter any general competition at the fair, such as photography and artwork, or any other area in which they might have an interest.

The work of younger children is also welcomed at the fair. Prizes are offered for various types of arts and crafts work, baking, and different types of novelties. There are more than 90 prizes offered to children in three different age classifications: under eight years, eight to 11 years, and 12 to 14 years.

In recent weeks, the Fair Board has been going over their Prize List for this year's fair, the 135th anniversary, and increasing the size of prizes offered wherever possible. It was felt that the

size of the prizes in the past had not been keeping up with the costs involved in craft or other work.

An Advance Prize List, listing the various competitions open at the fair, is printed and mailed out each spring to members of the Agricultural Society and those who exhibited at the fair last year. Others interested in receiving an Advance Prize List are asked to contact Agricultural Society secretary, Denny Charles at P.O. Box 116, Georgetown.

Home Economics and Shop teachers interested in more information about the Town and Country division are asked to contact the president of the Society's Ladies Division, Lamey Bird, or Marguerite French of Georgetown.

Meet Joyce Gosling - 1st woman president

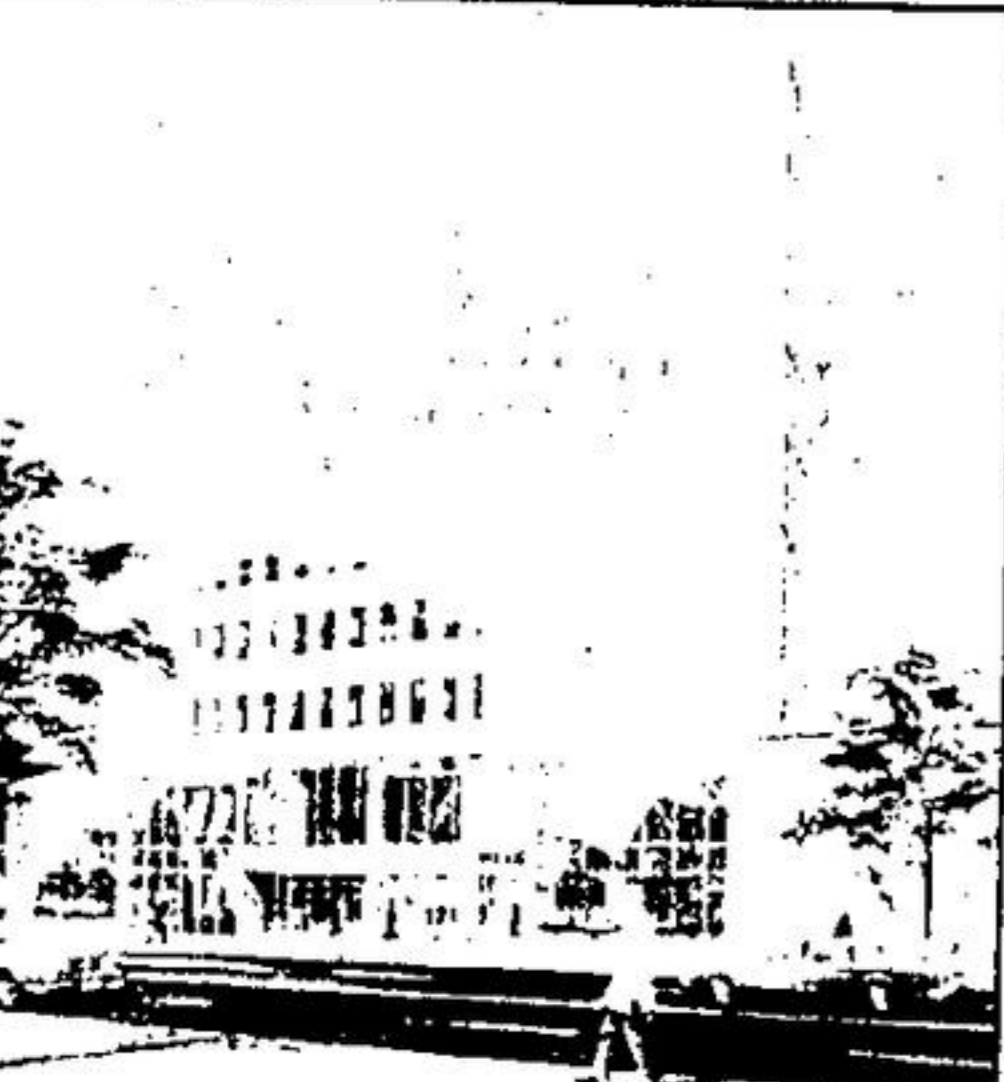
Joyce Gosling recently became president of the Georgetown Agricultural Society, the first woman president of the Fair Board in its 135-year history.

Home of the Week

URBAN THREE BEDROOM DESIGN WITH SPACE FOR DEVELOPMENT

This high-style split entry home design is perfectly suited to the medium frontage residential building lot, yet it provides for more than 1,300 square feet of finished floor area, for present use, and approximately 75% as great an area for future development on the unfinished lower level. The low-profile sophisticated exterior presents a classic facade which is reminiscent of a European provincial cottage. The fieldstone veneer and chimney, complemented by the mansard-style roof and the small-paned, deeply inset windows, creates the impression of an expensive and custom-designed home.

The double-doored main entry opens into a compact reception foyer which faces the twin half-stairways which are characteristic of the split entry home; the left-hand one leading up to the main living level, the right-hand one leading down to the unfinished lower level. The up stairway opens onto a compact reception foyer and outerwear storage area, from whence traffic moves naturally left, and into the spacious L-shape living-dining room combination. The living room features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace and large, elegant, small-paned windows. The dining area separates from the kitchen-dinette via convenient pocket door, for easy access and privacy when entertaining.

The well-organized L-shape kitchen-dinette combination has generous countertop work surfaces, abundant cupboard storage and a logical work triangle configuration. Adequate space is provided in the dinette area for either a full dining suite or built-in banquette-style nook furnishings. The kitchen-dinette may be fully isolated for privacy and hygiene.

All three bedrooms are positioned on the main living level, around the central bath and linen storage facility. Each has generous closet storage and excellent natural light. The master bedroom has a three-piece ensuite bath with shower.

The lower level has a roughed-in masonry fireplace, for the future development of a family or recreation room, and roughed-in plumbing for a three-piece second bathroom. The lower level provides ample space for the development of additional bedrooms or other living accommodations, thus greatly increasing the flexibility of the design. A double enclosed garage completes the convenience features of this practical and eye-catching home design.

Plans for design No. 78-1341 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$95.00 for the first set, and \$20.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$145.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$178.00.
