In looking towards next year's team Russiani says that several key positions will have to be filled and that it will be hard to replace the likes of overage players Pat Fung, Barry Trood, Steve Miller, Art Currie, Steve Kruk and Roy Dolman.

"I'm sure we can fill the positions but whether we can fill their shoes is another thing," Russiani says.

Russiani outlined some of the outstanding qualities of these players and indicated some of their characteristics that will be missed on next year's team.

Steve Miller is called by his teammates 'crazy legs' and 'the hustler' for the way he works for the team, Russiani says. "How do you replace a guy who hustles his tailbone for you?" the coach says.

"He's probably the best penalty killer in the league and he always gives 100 per cent. Steve will play hurt for you." The coach says that Miller must travel from Thornhill to every game after his work but he was always willing to make the commitment.

In Barry Trood's character, Russiani says that his "leadership qualities are unlimited. He has all round hockey abilities and is a team leader," he coach says.

"Barry would help out in the desire department. He had a tremendous desire to win."

Roy Dolman worked the year at a disadvantage Sabre the coach says because he was a right winger playing on the left side. But Dolman was "a very coachable and easy to get along with - a very easy-going boy," Russiani says. Roy is the type of boy that is very disciplined and if you tell him to do something he will do it.

Art Currie was easy for Jules Russiani to coach. "Tell Arty to do something

and it's done. His desire and will to win did a lot for the team," the coach says. Russiani also mentioned his ent-

husiasm, desire and 'guts' that meant a lot to the team. Arty has great physical strength, the coach says.

Steve Kruk would make an excellent assistant coach if Jules Russiani had to have one or wanted an assistant

coach. "Steve has a good knowledge of the game and has a will to win," Russiani says.

Championship for young adult

A very successful weekend of championship bowling took place at Georgetown Bowl with the local 'young adults' capturing 16 out of 18 qualifying spots for the provincial championships. In the Young Adult Bowlers Association Handicap Team District Finals of 5 games (2 teams to qualify), there were 15 teams of 5 bowlers each from Central Ontario competing. The Georgetown No. 1 team came first with 6585, Georgetown No. 3 was second with 6490 and the runner-up was Georgetown No. 4 with 6357, a complete sweep.

Members of the one team (the only one with 3 girls) are Sheila Beatty (269 high game), Wendy Freeland (238), Janet Burns (253), Paul Beatty (315) and Mark Reis (219). The second placers Georgetown No. 3 was comprised of Robin Richardson (263), Diane Leonard (286), Dave Paterson (216), Gary Richardson (314), and Rick Gourlie (287). The bowlers on the runner-up team were Anne-Marie Boisvenue (295), Iona Louth (232), Gary Hole (280), Bruce Clark (239) and Andre Boisvenue (267). On the Georgetown

No. 2 team, the girls bowled well above average but the boys had an off day.

In the scratch singles competition, there were 76 bowlers fighting for four spots for men and four spots for ladies. In the final game, Paul Beatty (Georgetown) took over first place with 1307 (a 261 average) from the all day leader Dave Roeder (Waterloo) with 1272. Rick Gourlie (Georgetown) was 3rd with 1268 and Gary Hole (Georgetown) 4th with 1259. The runners-up were Gary Richardson (Georgetown) 1215 and Andy Wideman (Waterloo) 1203. In the ladies' section, Sandy Cuthbert (Georgetown) pulled ahead in the last game with a 291 for 1231 (246 ave) over the tournament leader, Claudina Lista (Applewood) 1138 (268). Sheila Beatty (Georgetown) was 3rd with 1136 (269) and Diane Leonard 4th with 1114 (286). The runners-up were Robin Richardson (Georgetown) 1087 (283) and Janet Burns (Georgetown) 1061 (253).

The district finals qualifiers will advance to the Provincial Championship at Welland on April 25th.
