

Smith sets pace with two wins

It was a double victory for Doug Smith last Saturday and Sunday at the York University track complex as he won both the 800 metre and 1500 metre races in the Eastern Canadian indoor track and field championships.

In Smith's races there were prominent names such as Mark Gunby, second place in OFSAA 800 m, and Mark McCoy of Newfoundland, the Canadian cross country champion.

On Saturday Smith won the 800 metre race which he described as slow for the most part with the race being won in the final lap sprint.

His time was 1:57.1 followed by Mark Gunby .5 sec. behind him.

The 1500 metre sections which were run on Sunday were also won by Smith, but he was challenged by Mark McCoy. Smith ultimately won the 1500 m in a time of 3:56.0.

Most of the runners were from Ontario, with others from Quebec and the Maritimes. In this meet Smith was running for the Scarborough Optimists track club.

In these two races Smith said he felt good and considers himself in shape for the upcoming outdoor track season.

Fans will certainly see some super hockey played during the qualifying rounds at Seneca College over the March vacation.

Part of the success of the team is probably due to the fact that they do not rely on two or three key players. Every one of the boys is a potential goal scorer and in fact even the goalies have scored during the season.

Andrew Hoddinott (grade 4 Park School) right wing: agility and will to win make Andrew strong at both ends of the rink. His skating skills continually baffle the opposition making him a constant threat to the other team.

Curtis Green (grade 5 Kennedy) goalie: Curtis has excellent reflexes and can be counted on for the big save when the pressure is on. His aggressive style often distracts opposition shooters.

Kevin Roe (grade 4 Glenn Williams) defence: converted to defence during the season Kevin has learned to play his position well. Seldom caught out of position he allows his partner to move to the offence quite often.

Jason Knight (grade 4 Harrison) centre: a good stickhandler with an accurate shot. Jason can score at any time.

Doug McDermott (grade 4 Joseph Gibbons) left wing: Doug is a strong force and back checker who never quits. He does a good job digging the puck out of the corner.

Alan Gray (grade 5 Park School) centre: Alan is a quick agile skater with excellent forechecking skills. His goal scoring and checking make him a threat at all times.

Travis Gardiner (grade 4 St. Francis) right wing: playing right wing for a left shot is not easy. Travis has developed an accurate forward as well as backhand. Good two way checker.

Brent Presswood (grade 1 Wrightswood) centre: Brent is a strong skater with a strong shot. He can play defence on powerplays as well as centre.

John Brooker (grade 4 Holy Cross) defence: A tough defenceman in front of his own net, John can also let go a strong shot from the point at the other end.

Chris McCarthy (Grade 4

Joseph Gibbons) left wing: a hard skater who plays his position as well as anyone. Strong on both fore and backchecking, Chris is often on the spot to pick up quick goals.

Sean Cotton (grade 4 Kennedy) goalie: Sean has worked hard to develop his skills this year. His steady play now gives the team the clutch goaltending it needs at all times.

Jeremy Felce (grade 4 Park School) right wing: tough in the corners, Jeremy has the strength to keep the puck in the opposition end. Converted to wing during the season, Jeremy has often scored with his hard shot.

Adam Bennett (grade 4 Brisbane Public School) defence: a big strong rushing defenceman, Adam can shoot as hard as anyone in

the league. His reach and good reflexes make him hard to beat one-on-one. He switches easily from defence to offence.

Doug Kent (grade 5 Holy Cross) left wing: One of the most improved players, Doug is in his first year of Rep hockey. He has become a tenacious two way checker who can score with a quick shot.

Chris Stoddart (grade 5 Joseph Gibbons) defence: Chris is an excellent skater who never quits. His drive often makes it appear that we have one or two extra players on the ice. He has a strong point shot.
