## Penman discounts his role in Tory loss

an Acton school principal, brought his Conservative campaign to within 463 votes of victory. The riding previously had different boundaries and was held by Conservative Jim Snow, still the incumbent in Oakville riding.

Mr. Reed retained his seat two years later with a 3,000-vote plurality over Conservative George Gray. The 1977 election, for which there were 12,000 fewer eligible voters, also saw Bill Johnson's second unsuccessful election attempt for the NDP. There was a 69.1 per cent voter turn-out in the

riding that year. In Millon, meanwhile, the municipal councillor whose supporters were blamed for "scuttling" Mrs. Baines' nearly successful bid to unseat the incumbent discounted his role in the loss.

Brian Penman, whom Mrs. Baines defeated for the Tory nomination, said the controversy which Mrs. Baines claims cost her the riding was not of his making.

In retrospect, Mr. Penman says his assessment that the riding could be won by a Tory seems to have been accurate enough and therefore his

reasons for offering himself as a candidate for the nomination were also valid.

"The controversy was not of my making," he said. "If bitterness and hostility resulted, it was from the single-mindedness of the executive and their unwillingness to see a true nomination take place and the fact that they were so blatant and obvious about it that their conduct percolated through the entire riding."

"You can't anger the people and the press, then lose and transfer the blame to others.

The blame must rest where it must rest."

Mr. Penman added that, for him, the irony lies in the number of people he talked to who were totally unaware of the controversy which stemmed from Mrs. Baines' nomination and the ensuing court battle to prove its validity. It leaves him questioning what effect media publicity really has on voters' decisions.

"I don't think the vote was indicative of support for Fran," he says. "The high Tory turnout was indicative of the sweep taking place in the province."

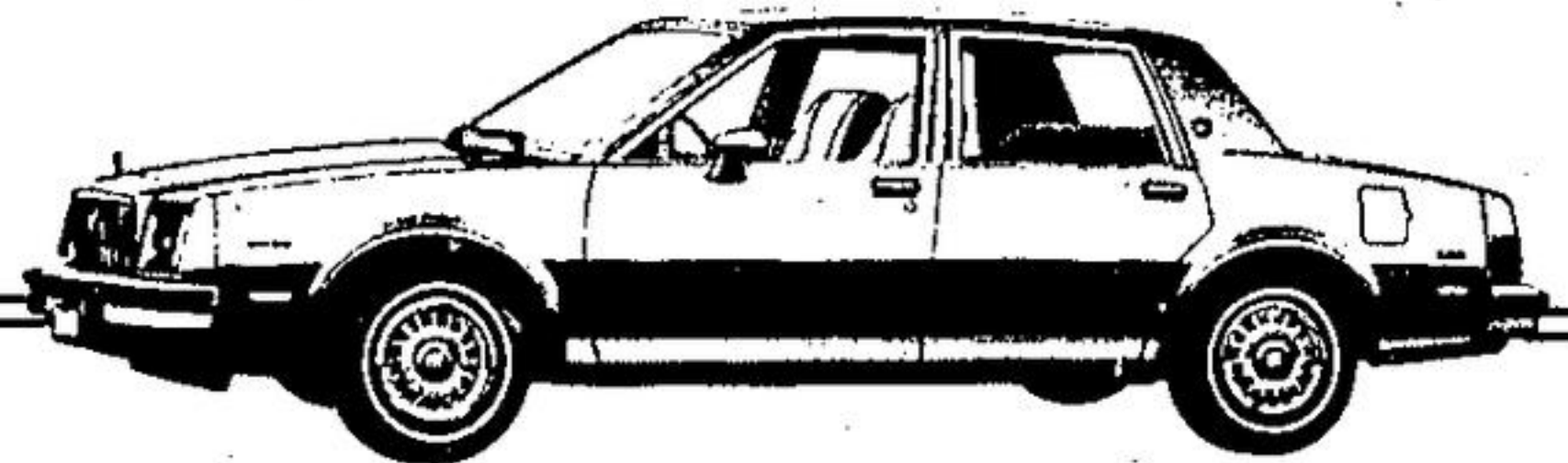

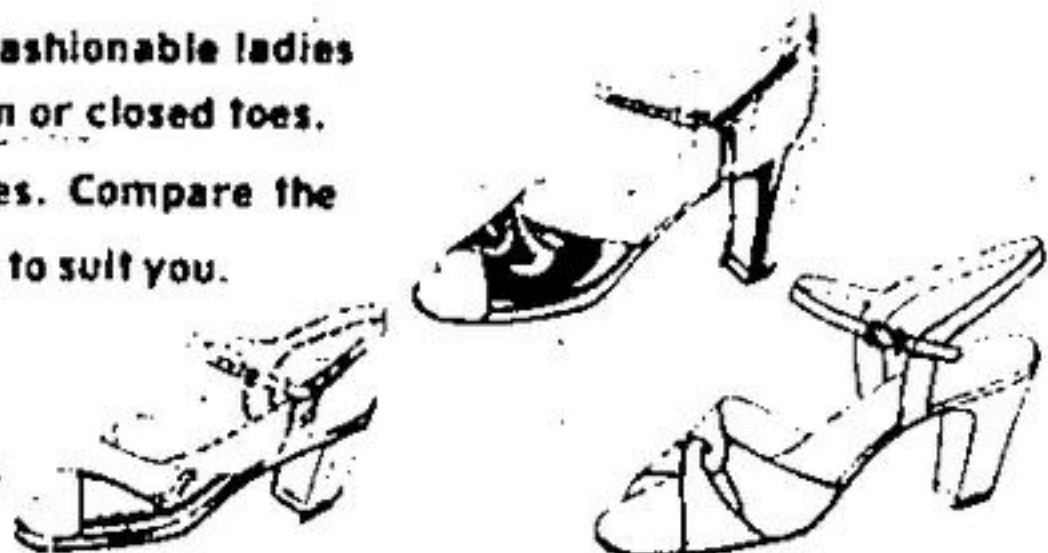

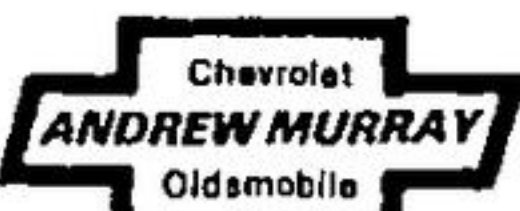
