

ANALYSIS: 3NT should be a universal contract on this deal, with West opening 1NT and East jumping directly to game on the strength of his 9HCP and good five-card suit. The opening lead of the HK should also be universal and declarer should win and cash his ten tricks for plus 630. In doing so, he must be careful to take his two top clubs before running dummy's diamonds - else he will lose the Club Q-J.

South, for his part, must hold onto his two top spades and a heart, while all this is going on, to limit declarer to ten tricks. An occasional deviation may occur when West holds up the H-A at trick one in an attempt to duce North into continuing hearts. This is a common play with AJ but it is incorrect here since, on a different lie of the cards, declarer could lose three spade tricks. If West tries such a ruse, North should not fall for it after seeing South's H-2.




