North has new planning council

such situations. One of the goals of the Council is to inform the community of the agencies and services available, how they can help, who can make use of them and where they can be contacted. To accomplish this, the Council plans an ongoing series of newspaper columns describing each of the services, such as the Community Legal Clinic, Legal Aid and access to the

Ontario Ombudsman. Long identified as a community need, the Volunteer Bureau will begin operating under the auspices of the Council. Its activities will start through Volunteer

Week, April 25 to May 2. In its efforts to promote volunteerism in north Halton and to enable groups with similar interests to engage in co-operative planning, the Council co-ordinated the application for a federal Manpower grant to employ three students at the Contact Centre, Halton Helping Hands and the Volunteer Bureau. The Council can also provide expertise in assisting groups who are seeking grants or making proposals to various agencies and levels of government. It may also act in an advocacy role on behalf of an individual

idea or agency dilemma. The Social Planning Council is a volunteer body composed of interested individuals with expertise in a wide variety of areas. Any Council, however, can be effective only if put to full use through direct input from citizens. The Council exists to deal with concerns and problems shared by individuals or agencies in the area and to assist them in reaching an appropriate solution.

An interim Board of Directors is serving until the annual meeting. The interim committee is composed of President Bill Tom; Vice Presidents Graham Bland and Sandy Symmes; Secretary Pat Haslett and Treasurer Dolly Moulden. Interim Board members are Peggy Balkind, Jack Birtch, Peter Branch, Arlene Callaghan, Mary Carpenter, Clark, Ferguson, Frank Hannah, Fran Jamieson, Len Kay, Bill Kort, Gwyn Ramsay, Walter Ridley, Mary Simpson, David Sinclair, Barbara Stevens and Erica Thompson.

Board members have involvement in a wide range of regional services, public agencies and volunteer organizations, including Social Services Centre, various churches, education, Red Cross, the Cancer Society, service clubs, Public Health, palliative care, Halton ADAPT, Halton Helping Hands, Elizabeth Fry Society, University Women's Club, Halton Women's Place, "ActiVan" Mental Health Clinic, Agriculture and women's institu-

The guest speaker at the Annual Meeting will be Norma Leps, co-ordinator of Day Care Services for Halton region. The programme will include election of the board of directors and approval of the Constitution.

Memberships for any one wishing to join the Council will be available at the door for a fee of \$5 and will allow the member to vote at this meeting. Memberships are open to anyone over the age of 16 who lives or works in Milton or Halton Hills.

The public is invited to attend to learn more about the North Halton Social Planning Council. Anyone with specific concerns should bring them in writing to the meeting for consideration at future meetings of the Council.

Copies of the Council's constitution may be seen in the libraries and municipal offices in Acton, Georgetown and Milton.
