The weather this Easter weekend was up and down and so were the balloons at Blue Springs Scout Camp, just west of Acton.

Sponsored by the Canadian Balloon Association, the fiesta drew many spectators, to raise money for the Boy Scouts of Canada.

Al Russell, president of the association and an Acton area resident, said Saturday the cost of a fiesta would be around \$300 for propane to fuel the balloons and food to fuel the organizers.

Five balloons were at the camp this weekend. Karen Rosenthal, of Toronto, the winner of a hound and hare race held in Elora last year by the Elora Commercial Guild to raise money for cystic fibrosis, said Saturday she planned to bring her balloon Sunday but wasn't positive because of the weather.

Toronto, brought his balloon as well as Newton Gingrich, of Baden, Ernie Cripps, of Kitchener and Ken Penfold and Larry Horach, of Toronto.

Mr. Horach will be one of six balloonists to compete in the World Hot Air Balloon Championships, June 20-27 in Battle Creek, Mich., said Mr. Russell. He said Mr. Horach qualified by becoming a Canadian champion.

Mr. Russell will be one of five jurors at the competitions. There are five countries entering, he said, and each country has a juror.

The balloons were up Friday at the reserve, but Saturday was a different story. Those spectators who showed up at 7 a.m. were bitterly disappoint-

ed when the balloons couldn't get off the ground due to 50 km an hour winds.

Around 4:30 they gave it a shot. The balloon went up, and pilot Hugh Wallace had a tough time going to handle it in the wind. After a few jolts to the ground, and as the audience watched the balloon faller from side to side nearly reaching the ground at one stage, the organizers began tying it up again.

Earlier, Mr. Russell had said, "Balloon patience is more than a virtue, it's an optimist's dream."

The balloons were scheduled to give flying a chance again Sunday. Mr. Russell said the amount of the proceeds should be known by the first of the week.
