

LOW-PROFILE THREE-BEDROOM SECOND HOME WITH SUNKEN LIVING ROOM

This spacious three bedroom leisure home design provides in excess of 1,200 square feet of well-arranged finished floor space and is perfectly suited to the medium frontage recreational building site, especially a sloping lot. The stylish rustic exterior is finished in horizontal channel siding, with a brick veneer chimney and a heavy shake roof. According to individual family preferences, the roof could be alternately finished in shingles.

The main entry leads into a short hallway which divides the kitchen and the laundry complex and the service core. The hall faces a spacious outdoor storage area. From the hallway, traffic moves naturally left and down into the spacious sunken living room. The living room features a raised hearth masonry fireplace and a sliding glass walk-through leading onto the large elevated rear balcony. Two steps and an optional spindle screen wall separate the living room from the elevated dining area.

A well-organized open U-style kitchen possesses a step-saving work triangle and abundant cupboard storage. It is conveniently open to the dining room, for easy access when serving meals.

All three bedrooms are grouped around the three-piece central bathroom and away from the main activity areas for freedom from disturbance. Each has good closet storage facilities and excellent exposure for view and natural light. The master bedroom has a full walk-in closet.
