Cantante Singers in concert tomorrow

"I'm usually a sacred singer," said Dave Shrubsole, guest artist for the upcoming Cantante Singers pop concert "Love Is". But May 9, Mr. Shrubsole will make his debut as a folk artist with tunes such as "You Fill Up My Senses" and "Sunshine On My Shoulder" by John Denver.

"He's the president of St. John's United Choir," Dale Wood, the choir's conductor commented, "and he's a good singer."

"I've never had any singing lessons," Mr. Shrubsole said. "But when you hear him sing, you'll know why. He doesn't need any," Mr. Wood added.

Mr. Shrubsole also sings with the Georgetown Choral Society and he "used to perform with Ken Harrison in Milton before he died. That's my only previous experience with folk music," he said.

Mr. Shrubsole, a teacher at Harrison Public School, is shy about expressing his natural talent, but conductor Dale Wood is encouraging him to perform.

Mr. Shrubsole's repertoire also includes "Chips", "Weekend in New England", and "Are You Lonesome Tonight". He will be accompanied by Mr. Wood on piano. The concert gets under way May 9 at St. John's United Church, 6 p.m.
