The Holy Cross team finished in a time of one hour and 44 minutes. That works out to about a seven minute mile over the entire race says teacher and coach, John Luciani.

The running club began training after the cross-country season finished in the Fall. The boys will continue running for the club until the track season starts next week.

Practice sessions for the team started with two mile runs but slowly the boys worked up to four miles about four times a week.

At last week's Burlington annual road race where 1500 runners took part Luciani placed 83th out of 363 runners. While the race attracts most of it's participants from the local area, the event also drew runners from London, Toronto and Brampton.

More than 270 volunteers, manning checkpoints, water stations and the finish line played an important role in staging the popular event.

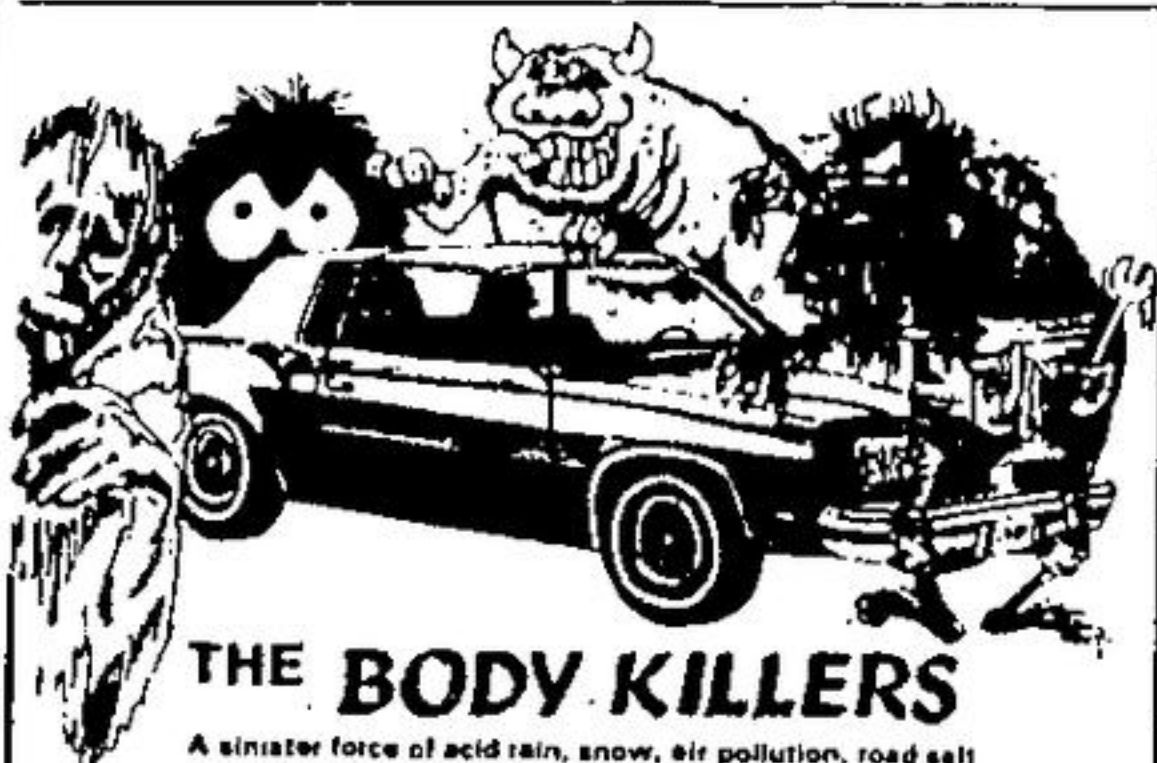
