tunes by contemporary artists such as Barry Manilow (Daybreak, Ready to take a Chance), Jim Croce (Time in a Bottle) and Moe Koffman (Swinging Shepherd Blues). A variety of arrangements sparkled with clear harmonies a flute accompaniment and a mixture of solo artists. The controlled singing of the choir and the balanced, gentle harmonies kept the audience entertained for the entire performance.

The choir started off with a Beatles medley, then proceeded to one of the prettiest melodies of the night when they sang the theme from the movie, Mahogany.

Guest artist Dave Shrubsole was on hand to lend his powerful and controlled voice to the evening. Mr. Shrubsole is a Georgetown resident who is the president of the St. John's senior choir. His appearance with the Cantante Singers will help in broadening his interest in future musical productions. The Harrison public school teacher is interested in becoming a member of the Globe productions troupe which may soon be revived.

Cantante Singer Brenda Archer sang "You Don't Bring Me Flowers," in her solo effort and distinguished herself by

singing with her heart in her clear soft voice.

Nancy Keslick played her own piano arrangement of "You Needed Me". We hope she will continue with her compositions as this young artist is just beginning to explore this area of composing.

During the first half of the show, Cathy McGowan accompanied the choir on her flute for Moe Koffman's Swinging Shepherd Blues.

In the second half of the program, Becky Halonen sang

The Rose in her solo performance. Becky has a pure, controlled voice and over the past two years she has developed a roundness in quality.

Denise Duffe and Dave Shrubsole teamed up for a final number when they sang a heart-warming rendition of "Good Friends are for Keeps". Denise shows potential for the musical theatre as she displays a gentle, sensitive expression while singing.

Overall, the program was

tasteful and well put-together by conductor Dale Wood. The show could easily have run for two nights based on the turnout to see the singers. The concert itself did not peak but rather flowed from one song to the next - it never let the audience down.

It's admirable of conductor Wood to encourage the young people into performing solo efforts, as it stimulates an interest by the singers and adds variety to the choir's repertoire.
