Penrice succeeds Crawford as Chamber president

Still objects to IGA

Optimism that a proposal for an expanded IGA plaza in Acton would proceed without a hitch dwindled Monday night as another developer sald he would only drop his objection to the plan if the town is prepared to let him build a shopping centre on the community's eastern boundary. In a letter to Coun. Mike Armstrong, the town's planning board chairman, Landawn Shopping Centres president Jerry Sprackman said he is ready to drop a zoning objection to the IGA proposal slated for the site of the old Dominion Hotel once the town redrafts Acton's urban boundaries, including the Landawn proposal within the community's limits. While the Landawn proposal and the town's objections are already headed for an Ontario Municipal Board hearing. The Fread-Kassian Investments Limited IGA idea may eventually wind up there as well.


