

Silver Creek plans concern CVCA

Concern over the future of its new Silver Creek Conservation Area has prompted the Credit Valley Conservation Authority to prepare a report for the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) suggest-ing revisions in the Commis-

sion's future acquisition plans.

The report, prepared by senior conservation planner Rose Menyes and approved by the Authority executive Friday, was to be presented at the NEC's Halton sector hearings Monday in Burling-

Ms. Menyes told the executive Friday that the NEC's proposed land use plan does recognize the Authority's Silver Creek lands as property already granted by the province for conservation use. If implemented, she warned. the NEC plan could be confusing for the public and for the various agencies involved in approval processes.

Ms. Menyes' report asks the NEC to revise the plan's future acquisitions section and better reflect the co-operation between the NEC and the Authority. The Authority has already given the proposed plan its support in principle.
