

Acton Bulldog team limit tugging schedule

Acton's tug-of-war team, the Acton Bulldogs will only compete in two events this year. Team captain Chuck Mitchell said the Bulldogs lost half their members over the winter and will therefore only be entering the Speyside Highland Games, June 13, and Acton Fall Fair, Sept. 20.

Mr. Mitchell said the team is looking for another eight heavyweights in the 200 to 240 pound (or more) category.

He has 10 people to participate at the Speyside games but some of them are only coming because it's at home. A team

needs eight members on field and several more spares, he said. Anyone interested in joining them is invited to call him.

Although the team had several offers of sponsors this year, Mr. Mitchell said he had to turn them down because he didn't feel they could compete properly with such a small group.

The team is still practising Wednesday nights at 8 p.m. in Prospect Park but last year they practised two and three nights a week. If more members come along Mr. Mitchell said the team might still

manage to get into some events this year since the heaviest part of the season for tug-of-war competition is in the fall.

Mr. Mitchell will be competing in the hammer throw and possibly the caber toss and farmers' walk at the Speyside games as an individual entry as well as taking part in the tug-of-war.

"I enjoy competing and I'm in reasonably good shape," he said. "I worked out at the Y and taught weight-lifting classes all winter so I'm feeling pretty good now."

EYE-APPEALING SPLIT ENTRY HOME WITH EXTRA SPACE

This high-style split entry home design is ideally suited to the wide frontage residential building lot and provides almost 1,800 square feet of well-arranged finished floor area, for present use, and nearly as great an amount of potential living accommodations, for future development, in the unfinished lower level. The imposing exterior is finished in mixed horizontal channel siding and brick veneer, with brick chimney and a twin-peaked heavy shake roof. The roof could be alternately finished in conventional shingles, according to personal preference and regional material costs.

The elevated main entry leads into a spacious two-story high reception foyer and outerwear storage area, which contains the twin hall-stairways characteristic of the split entry design type: one leading down to the unfinished lower level, the other leading up to the main living level.

The main landing leads traffic directly forward and into the very large L-shape living-dining room combination. The living room features a raised-hearth masonry back-to-back fireplace, and French doors leading onto a wide, front-facing balcony. The dining area separates from the kitchen-family room via convenient pocket door, for greater privacy when entertaining.

A well-planned double L-shape kitchen and spacious family room-TV lounge area divides the bedroom area from the living-dining room area; providing for disturbance-free entertaining. The kitchen provides generous countertop work surfaces, abundant cupboard storage and a logical work triangle configuration. The kitchen divides from the family room via short work counter, which latter could easily be modified during construction into a convenient snack-bar counter. The family room contains the opposite side of the back-to-back masonry fireplace, and has a wide sliding glass walk-through which provides access to the wide rear balcony.

All three bedrooms are positioned along one wall of the design and well away from the main living area. Each has good exposure for view and natural light, and ample closet storage. The large master bedroom boasts a three-piece ensuite bathroom; with tub, a full walk-in closet, and a charmingly formal projecting bow window. The rear bedroom has a sliding glass walk-through providing access to the rear patio.

The unfinished lower level provides a roughed-in fireplace and roughed-in plumbing for a three-piece bathroom to serve as the basis for future living accommodations and recreational areas.

Plans for design No. 81-1795 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$110.00 for the first set and \$20.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$165.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$200.00.
