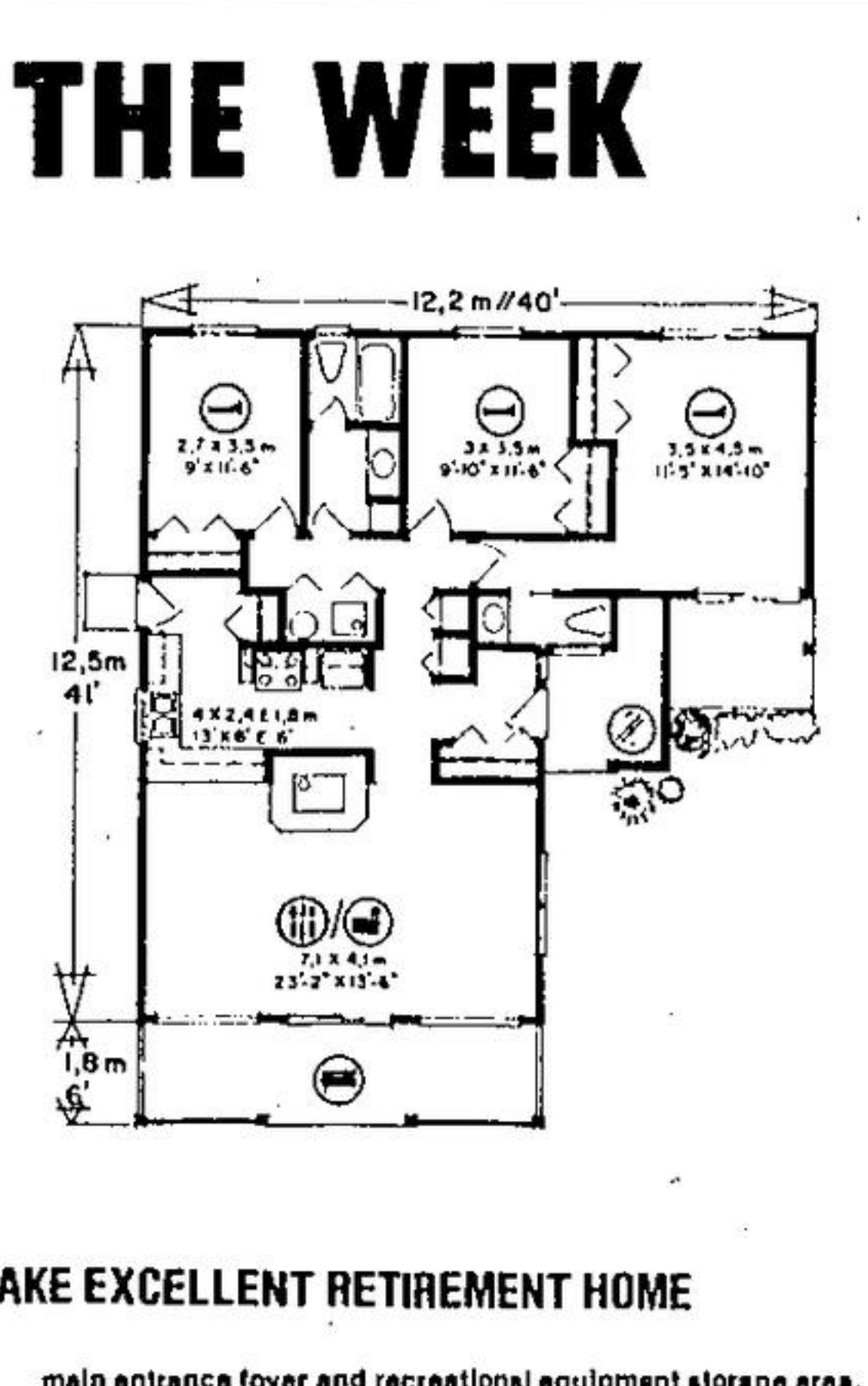
THREE BEDROOM COTTAGE COULD MAKE EXCELLENT RETIREMENT HOME

This three bedroom recreational home design is perfectly suited to the narrow frontage cottage building site, yet it provides in excess of 1,200 square feet of well-arranged finished floor area on its one level. The design would make an excellent holiday and week-ending leisure home for the larger family, or an outstandingly practical retirement home for the couple whose children have grown and fled the nest. The construction is economical and ensures low-maintenance, as does the horizontal channel siding and shake roof of the exterior decor. For those who prefer, the roof could be alternately finished in shingles, according to regional material costs and personal preference.

The main entry leads into a compact reception foyer and outdoor storage area, which could be enclosed by the simple addition of a door to create an energy-conserving vestibule, which serves as an air-lock between indoor and outdoor areas. From the foyer, traffic moves naturally to the left and directly into the large living room-dining room combination. The living room features an energy-efficient Franklin-type wood-burning stove and a sliding glass walk-through, which latter provides easy access to the full-width front veranda. In areas plagued by noxious insects, the veranda could easily be fully enclosed and screened for pest-free enjoyment of outdoor dining and other activities.

An L-shape kitchen provides a natural and step-saving work triangle configuration, generous countertop work surfaces and ample cupboard storage. The counter which presently divides the kitchen and the dining area could be alternately constructed as a convenient snack bar counter, or a wet bar for those who entertain a great deal while on vacation.

A two-piece vanity bathroom is positioned adjacent to the



main entrance foyer and recreational equipment storage area, and convenient to all areas of the cottage. For greater security and heat retention, this storage area could be completely enclosed, thus conserving energy or increasing the cooling effect in hot weather.

All three bedrooms are positioned along one wall of the floor plan and well away from the main activity areas for freedom from disturbance. Each has generous closet storage facilities and good exposure for view and natural light. The master bedroom has a sliding glass walk-through, which latter could also be fully enclosed and screened against noxious pests without sacrificing any of its convenience.

Plans for design No. 1-1246 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$110.00 for the first set and \$20.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$165.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$200.00.
