

Stewarttown wins track finals

At the North Halton track and field finals for senior public schools Stewarttown were declared the winners with 418 points while Centennial followed with 413 points in a tight race for top position. W.I. Dick, who were defending champions finished third with 396 points.

For Stewarttown, it was the first time in ten years they have won the senior public school track and field crown. In the junior division, Centennial took first place honors with W.I. Dick second and Stewarttown third.

The Intermediate races were captured by Stewarttown as Centennial and W.I. Dick finished second and

third respectively. Senior division champions were from W.I. Dick while Stewarttown was second and Centennial third.

The next day at the North Halton relays Stewarttown again won top honors by finishing first while Centennial finished second. Of the nine relay races Stewarttown won six, Centennial, W.I. Dick and Sam Sharrett collecting one win each. Stewarttown set three meet records in the relay competition.

Also competing in the track and field meets were Brookville and MacKenzie Smith.
