Instruction plus 'fun' for sports camp

Teaching tools plus sports knowledge are the key to this camp's expertise

The North Halton Sports Camp is ready to start preparations for their sixth season of providing boys and girls of Halton Hills with a well structured program of hockey and sports instruction in a "fun-oriented atmosphere."

Says one of the camp directors, Chris Milne, the Sports Camp is getting better every year and the longevity of the camp's existence is one proof of its popularity among the boys, says Milne. Leadership and a proven organized program are some of the strong points of this camp guided by camp directors Bob Tost, Chris Milne, Neil Cotton and Doug Anderson.

The staff of the Sports Camp are all well-known athletes in Halton Hills who have distinguished themselves in both sporting and teaching roles. In fact, three of the instructors are high school teachers in the area. Chris Milne says that there is now an emphasis on having qualified teachers instruct at hockey schools rather than NHL stars.

"Teachers know how to have fun with the kids and teach skills at the same time," Milne says. He is extremely enthusiastic with this year's staff. New to the North Halton Sports Camp is Tom Martin, a former Georgetown Chrysler Raider, Toronto Toro and a four-year coaching veteran in Sweden. Martin has ten years pro experience as a hockey player and ran a

sports camp in Bramalea. Neil Cotton is a well-known individual in the local hockey circles, having played with Chris Milne and fellow Georgetown Raiders when they advanced to Campbellville for the Eastern Canadian championships. Cotton is a teacher at Georgetown District high school and is in his third year with the Sports Camp. He is a level three coach and instructs in coaching clinics across Ontario.

Morley Leeking, also from Georgetown District high school will be lending his support and guidance to the Sports Camp in their office program. Leeking plays industrial ball during the summer and was picked as the all-star Halton West basketball coach of 1981. He will be the Camp's instructor who will look after baseball, soccer, swimming, ball hockey and other fun oriented aspects of the school.

Brian Hayward who is Cornell University's star goalie will be assisting with the goaltender sessions on the ice and will work with other instructors on off-ice activities some of which will pertain to goaltenders and their need to sharpen their reflexes and conditioning.

Dale Law is a high school instructor who will be helping with the power skating and hockey skills portion of the program. He is an accomplished athlete who plays both hockey and baseball. Chris Milne, a former Raider and Sudbury Wolves

forward also joins the group in his sixth season. The Sports Camp program

costs \$85 per week with the cost including a lunch every day plus three hours of ice

time per day. The location is Gordon Alcott arena and the Camp runs in one week

sessions from August 10 to September 4. For more information call 877-7777.

Support group ready for fall training
