

Mixed fortunes for cricketers

Georgetown had mixed fortunes over the weekend with a double-header. One common feature in both the games was that the Georgetown team were at least two short of the regular eleven.

Heavy windy conditions against Milton Saturday June 6 made batting extremely difficult for both teams. Georgetown playing their first away game at Milton won the toss and decided to bat first. The pitch was easy-paced but there was a heavy cross wind which made the ball move in the air and occasionally "hang up" in the air.

Georgetown opened their innings through R. Mongru and S. Jahoor. But the team ran into trouble when H. Crooks struck two deadly blows. First he clean bowled Mongru for two and had A. Emmanuel L.B.W. with his very next ball. Both the wickets fell at 8. A. Kumar joined Jahoor with the bowler Crooks on "hat trick". He first averted the hat trick and stood firm at one end hoping to find a suitable partner to get the team out of trouble.

Although Kumar had scored only nine runs out of 22, he had played himself "in" and was well set to attack after nearly 18 overs of batting. Mongru soon followed at 29 but A. Dean, B. Windson and S. Tancoo added 5, 4 and 4 to push the Georgetown total to 41. This is the lowest score recorded by Georgetown in 3 years. For Milton, McGowan took 3 wickets for 16 runs.

WINDSON SUPERB
Georgetown went into field to the bowling of A. Windson and N. Samaroo. Windson bowling with superb control on his length, direction and swing sent Milton reeling by clean bowling the first three batsmen with only 10 on the board. At this stage Georgetown "missed" a crucial catch in the slips which literally swung the game back to Milton.

Georgetown reversed the tables on Sunday playing a home game against Brampton Cricket Club. Brampton won the toss and elected to bat first. N. Samaroo opened the attack for Georgetown with G. Bland, who was making his debut for the club. Samaroo sent back both the Brampton openers for 14 runs.

A quick bowling change put G. Bland into attack again with Right hand medium paced bowling. Bland struck 4 quick blows sending the Milton team back for 103 runs. For Georgetown, G. Bland had an excellent game claiming 4 for 19 while N. Samaroo and A. Kumar got 3 for 20 and 3 for 25 respectively.

Georgetown opened the innings with S. Jahoor and R. Mongru in trouble when Brampton dismissed Jahoor for 2 and Campbell for 1. With score standing at 16 for 2 wickets A. Kumar joined Mongru and the pair after playing themselves "in" literally tore the Brampton bowling to shreds.

SPACIOUS SPLIT ENTRY HOME WITH THREE BEDROOMS

This alpine-style three bedroom home design is perfectly suited to the medium-framing residential building lot and provides in excess of 1,000 square feet of finished floor space, for present use, and almost as great an amount of additional accommodation, in potential, in the un-finished lower level. The Bavarian-style exterior is finished in horizontal channel siding, with brick veneer accents, and topped with a heavy shake roof. For those who prefer, the roof could be alternately finished in shingles.

The main entry leads into a compact reception foyer, which faces twin half-stairways; the left-hand one leading down to the un-finished lower level, the right-hand one leading up to the main living level. The main landing and reception area leads traffic naturally right and into the large living room. The living room features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace for convivial "at-homes", and a wide sliding glass walk-through leading onto the large front-facing balcony.

A well-planned U-shape kitchen-dinette combination provides generous cupboard storage, abundant countertop work surfaces and a sensible work triangle configuration. The dinette area features a sliding glass walk-through which provides access to the wide, rear-facing balcony. For those who prefer, the kitchen-dinette could be completely isolated via installation of a convenient pocket door, allowing greater privacy and hygiene.

All three bedrooms are positioned well away from the main activity areas, for freedom from disturbance. Each has generous closet storage and excellent exposure for view and natural light. The spacious master bedroom has a three-piece ensuite bathroom with shower.

The un-finished lower level has a roughed-in fireplace and a roughed-in three-piece bathroom as the basis for future development of additional living accommodations and/or recreational facilities.

Plans for design No. 81-1092 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$110.00 for the first set and \$20.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$185.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$200.00.
