'Welcome aboard' McDermid says

In a formal statement last week, Brampton-Georgetown MP John McDermid officially welcomed the decision by William Nelson Ltd. to relocate its dairy operation in Georgetown with a new \$13 million plant that will employ 200 workers by 1982. Wishing the company "many years of prosperity" in their new location, Mr. McDermid noted that the planned 110,000 square foot plant will have the capacity to produce 150 million litres of milk products annually.

An end to measles?

Halton region appears ready to endorse a program aimed at eradicating measles in the area. Last week, the health and social services committee supported a resolution drafted by the Society of Medical Officers of Health in Ontario calling on the provincial government to impose compulsory immunization in schools. Similar programs in the U.S., regional health officer Dr. Peter Cole pointed out in a recent letter, have been extremely successful in combatting and "dramatically" cutting down on outbreaks of the disease. In endorsing the medical officer's position, the committee urged that the government act at the "carliest possible date" to begin the vaccination program. 
