JUNE TIPS Flowers, especially roses, will keep best if cut in the afternoon or evening. This is when the stems and leaves contain most sugar.

Plastic garbage bags tied to stakes in the garden snap and rustle in the wind and scare away birds and rabbits. You don't need "new" bags for those "scare crows".

Mulch to conserve moisture. At least a minimum of five to eight centimetres of mulch will be needed to keep down the weeds. Don't underestimate the amount needed. Be sure to cultivate and remove the weeds before you mulch.

Buy or borrow a guide to native edible plants, Many weeds made a delicious vegetable. Try eating your weeds.

Keep the soil around all growing plants, loosened. It keeps both air and nutrients available and kills weeds before they break through the surface of the soil.
