# Boy wonder new director of education

The Halton Board of Education announced the appointment last Wednesday of its new Director of Education, Walter Beever, a man who has what Chairman Bill Lawson calls "a good track

Mr. Beevor is currently Director for the Lakehead Board of Education in Thunder Bay and will be taking the helm here in Halton when Emerson Lavender steps down next January. Mr. Beever will begin working with the Board and its staff no later than Nov. 15 for a transition period designed to keep things running smoothly. He will look at how the Halton board operates and perhaps make a few recommenda-

At 40 years of age, Mr. Beevor is the youngest director of the Halton board, but he has been described as a




