'Boy wonder' new director of education

The Halton Board of Education announced the appointment last Wednesday of its new Director of Education, Walter Beevor, a man who has what Chairman Bill Lawson calls "a good track record".

Mr. Beevor is currently Director for the Lakehead Board of Education in Thunder Bay and will be taking the helm here in Halton when Emerson Lavender steps down next January. Mr. Beevor will begin working with the Board and its staff no later than Nov. 15 for a transition period designed to keep things running smoothly. He will look at how the Halton board operates and perhaps make a few recommendations.

At 40 years of age, Mr. Beevor is the youngest director of the Halton board, but he has been described as a

"boy wonder". In his five-year tenure with the Lakehead board, he improved relations within the system drastically and helped curb vandalism, which was a major problem in the area's schools. Mr. Lawson said he started at Lakehead when things were at their lowest, and is leaving Thunder Bay with a reputation as being a harmonious and well-run operation.

The Halton board is currently concerned with improving its employee-board relations and feels optimistic since Mr. Beevor's management experience is extensive.

Mr. Beevor was chosen from a list of 12 potential applicants and was considered to be the board's number one choice.

Mr. Lavender will be retiring in January after six years as Director of Education for the Halton Board.
