Access: Law stretches to meet needs of handicapped citizen

LEGAL RIGHTS OF HANDICAPPED PEOPLE BY JUDITH KEENE

The main problem of the handicapped is "access" that is, opportunity to "get at" the things most people take for granted, such as an ordinary education or a chance at a job. The handicapped don't want charity or temporary assistance. All they require is a chance to compete fairly with able-bodied people without unnecessary obstacles being placed in their way. Unfortunately, through ignorance and force of habit, able-bodied society does place obstacks in the path of handicapped people. This column will discuss some of those obstacles and what might be done to alleviate them.

sign of most public and private buildings, the average sidewalk and street crossing, and public transit of all kinds from street cars to commercial airlines, makes it impossible for many handicapped people

to get about. b) access to jobs and services - adequate education, employment opportunities and access to "public" accommodation, services and facilities, are all difficult if not impossible for a handicapped person to achieve. In part this is a problem of physical accessibility, but much of the problem is people who discriminate by refusing to give handicapped persons a chance to prove themselves, and legislation which is discriminatory in

LEGISLATIVE CHANGES NEEDED 1. The Canadian Human

Rights Act While physical handicap is mentioned as an prohibited ground of discrimination under the Act, it is not "covered" in respect of all discriminatory practices. Housing, services. goods and facilities provided to the public by corporations or agencies that are federally controlled may legally be denled to the handicapped. The Canadian Human Rights Act does forbid discrimination in employment by reason of handleap, but (an important ommission) the Canadian Human Rights Commission has no power to order an employer to make even minor changes in the workplace that would enable a handlcapped employee to work successfully, (such as wider doorways braille (ypewriters, etc.)

Lobbyists for handicapped persons' rights would like to see the Canadian Human Righ's Act altered with both substantive changes as discussed above, and a change in the scope of the Act so that it would affect all Federal legislation. That way, for example, changes would have to be made to the regulations governing Via Rall and Air Canada, two services which have done little to ease the travel problems of many people. The National Building Code might also be affected. (The code governs building in a way similar to the Ontario Building Code, discussed below).

2. The Ontario Human Rights

Code There is a new Ontario Human Rights Bill (Bill 209) that may become law quite soon. Handicapped people are protected in the Bill, but there is some concern about "loopholes", particularly on the subject of what is expected of an employer. As the Bill stands, there is very little legal pressure on employers to attempt to make even modest and inexpensive changes to the workplace changes that would make employment truly accessible to the handicapped.

Another concern with Bill 209 is that it does not specifically include education among the public services in which it outlaws discrimination. There is a great concern among handicapped people about the effect of educational segregation - our practice of shunting off to a "special" school any student who doesn't "fit" the traditional classroom, (see be-

3. The Education Amendment

The new Education Amendment Act provides in Ontario a clear right to "special" education for those who are judged to need it. However, there are no guarantees anywhere as to

the quality of "special" education. Furthermore, special education has its drawbacks. Many handicapped people feel that educational segregation in a special school can cripple a child socially, making it difficult for him or her to deal with people who don't share his or her handleap. An increasing number of parents of handicapped children are struggling to maintain their sons and daughters in the "normal" school system for this reason. Often this means considerable expense of time and money. These parents may well wonder why no one seems to demand that ordinary schools make relatively small and inexpensive changes to curriculum and classroom so as to fit the school to the child.

4. The Ontario Building Code Changes to the Code, which governs all building in Ontario, would go a long way toward helping handicapped people in their struggle to live independant lives. Part 5 of the Code was intended to increase the accessibility of certain buildings, but Part 5 applies to very few types of buildings and has many "loopholes" through which builders can avoid compliance with the legislation. Buildings not required to be accessible include all types of housing, (even apartment buildings and Public Housing) all places of employment and, among others, recreational facilities, passenger stations and depots, hotel and motel rooms, boarding houses, barber and hair dressing shops, dry cleaners', dentists' and doctors' offices, laundromats, stores and shops and police

This is the state of the Bullding Code despite recommendatlons by study groups struck by the Ontario Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Affairs and by the Ontario Advisory Council on the Physically Handicapped.

WHAT CAN BE DONE The most effective way of getting legislative change is by making your wishes known to elected representatives. You have a right to find out from your School Board what they propose to do to assist handleapped students. You can also write to the cabinet Ministers responsible for the relevant legislation; the Minister of Community and Social Services, the Minister of Labour tresponsible for the Ontario Human Rights Code) and the Minister of Consumer and Commercial Relations (responsible for the Ontario Build-

ing Code). Personally, you can examine your own attitudes to handlcapped people as employees, co-workers, or neighbors. A simple readiness to give people a chance would go a long toward solving the problems of disability.
