Cornwell races at Welland County

Two Georgetown short trackers, Jon Cornwell and first year expert Steve Duff cleaned up in the lightweight class at Welland tonight running one-two throughout the final.

Cornwell, nursing an engine rebuilt just four hours before the race was pressed hard by Dull who had won the class at Welland two weeks previously, Cornwell, taking a busman's holiday offered by a rare break in the U.S. championship series, rode Welland for the fun of it but obviously enjoyed the fact that he had lost none of his expertise on that fickle track.
