Region's wheelin' and dealin'

Hoping to take advantage of any drop in interest rates over the summer, regional councillors decided last Wednesday to let Halton's treasurer, Gerry Lawson, shop around for a lucrative market on which to issue possibly as much as \$14 million worth of debentures. A form of borrowing money, the debentures may be issued in either American or Canadian funds, Mr. Lawson said, adding that by negotiating through Wood Gundy and A.E. Ames financial consultants (rather than tendering out for advisors) the treasury department should be able to act quickly if the interest rates drop. By remaining flexible in its decision to negotiate in both currencies, the region could save a considerable amount of money in interest payments.
