Travel
discounts

With summer here, senior citizens are on the go. Some railways, airlines and bus lines offer reduced fares for those 65 and over. When travelling, always ask for seniors' rates. Some of the following discounts may change without notice.

VIA RAIL gives you one-third off basic fares of more than \$4. any time of the year except between Christmas and New Years'. All you need for the discount is proof of age.

ONTARIO NORTHLAND RAILWAY and its associated bus services will give you a 50 percent discount off regular fares every day any time of the year.

VOYAGEUR BUS LINES has a 50 percent discount off regular fares every day except Fridays and Sundays.

GREYHOUND BUS LINES allows a 10 percent discount weekdays Monday to Thursday travel.

GRAYCOACH LINES gives a similar 10 percent discount any day of the week anytime of the year.

GO TRANSIT gives seniors a 50 percent discount anytime.

AIR CANADA provides a 25 percent discount on Domestic Routes only.

CP AIR allows a 20 percent discount on Domestic Routes.

NORDAIR allows a 30 percent discount off fares. Many parks are free or have reduced fares for seniors in Ontario. In addition there are reduced admission rates to historical sites and major tourist attractions. Some hotels, motels and restaurants offer reduced rates. Inquire before making reservations.
