The Miniature Village has

100 exact replicas of houses, shops, churches and farms found throughout Southern Ontario, built to one-twelfth scale. They are fully landscaped complete with a miniature population, cars, trucks and trains all displayed for perfect viewing.

Next stop was at the Holiday Inn in Oshawa for a buffet lunch, then to Parkwood Gardens, where the grounds are breathtakingly beautiful,

with twelve acres of trees, shrubs, fountains, marble seats and ornamental pools.

A graceful spiral staircase provides access to the second floor. In the foyer is an organ with the pipes concealed behind the silk panels forming the staircase wall.

Colonel McLaughlin died in 1972 in his 101st year and Parkwood was bequeathed to the Oshawa General Hospital.

Last stop was a visit to the Antique Car Museum where ancient cars of all descriptions are stored. Some makes we had never heard of, but all are kept in shining condition. The bus brought us back to Hillcrest at six p.m.
