# Flea market, entertainment bash may end first season for Actario

Plans are underway to wind up the first year of Actario draws with a real bang, says draw organizer Ted Tyler.

The group wants to hold a day-long flea market and antique sale complete with live local entertainment and several other attractions at the Aug. 29 draw, he said. Council has agreed to close Willow Street so booths can be installed for merchants from the old town hall at Willow and Bower Streets south to Mill Street. If enough participants come forward the market area may extend south of Mill to Church Street.

Mr. Tyler said the August trip will be drawn at that date and since it is the final draw for the year it will be slightly more valuable than the regular monthly trips.

"We haven't got quite all the fleas nalled down yet," Mr. Tyler joked, "but we want it to be just a little extra special to wind up the series."

Actario draws over the past year have raised about \$28,000 towards the cost of restoring Actario's 99-year-old red brick town hall.

The second year of Actario may see a change in the percentage of money going to ticket selling organizations, Mr. Tyler said, but funds will continue to be set aside for the town hall.

Weekly draws in the first year awarded cash prizes of more than \$300 to the lucky winner and merchandise prizes donated by Acton merchants were awarded as bonus prizes each week. Once a month the winner received a trip valued around \$1,200.

Mr. Tyler said a similar format will be used for the second series of draws but a few changes may still be made in an effort to get more people helping to organize the draws.
