Phone co-op in Erin?

The Committee for Better Service (CBS) is serious about forming a co-operative and renting long distance telephone service from Bell Canada, a spokesman said Sunday.

CBS, which represents telephone subscribers in the two Bell Canada exchanges in the Erin Township area, is dissatisfied with the results of a meeting with Bell Canada officials last week.

Bell Canada continues to refuse to provide toll-free extended area long distance service (EAS) for the two exchanges. The CBS protest of rate hikes for the Continental Telephone Company and an extended toll-free calling area forced the sale of the exchanges to Bell Canada in 1980.

CBS spokesman Robin Searle said that after fighting to get better telephone service in the Erin and Hillsburgh exchanges for several years, CBS is frustrated to find they are very close to qualifying for EAS.

The exchanges are close, but not quite close enough, under new guidelines approved recently by the Canadian Radio-television Telecommunication Commission (CRTC), the Bell Canada regulatory agency.

The guidelines, a revision and tightening of criteria for extending toll-free service, must show that exchanges are adjacent, the rate centres of the two exchanges must be within 30 miles of each other, there must be a 60 per cent
