The old Red Cross pro-gram was developed in 1946 and since that time, the needs of the individuals using the programs have changed. As a result, the Red Cross has totally changed their swim program levels as we have known them. The "New" Water Safety program level names and the order in which they will be taught, from non swimmer to


