An excellent crowd gathered for the 8 o'clock start. It was all or nothing for the Glen men.

Terry Haines was ready to go at the Erin batters. Regular shortstop Robbie Hatcher was needed to catch for Terry. The combination was perfect. Terry's drop ball worked perfect, and his rise ball even better. Throughout nine innings of ball Terry gave up only one hit, two walks and fanned out 11 of the Erin batters. Hatcher, behind the plate, did not give up a "passed ball" throughout the whole game.

In the second inning Mike Reynolds got on base and advanced to third. Larry Wheeler punched out a single to advance Reynolds for the first run scored in the game.

In the third, Terry Haines cracked out a single to start the inning. Dean Hancock got to first on a "fielders choice." Hatcher punched out another single, advancing Hancock. Then up came Andy Broadbent, with players in scoring position Broadbent cracked out a hit scoring Hancock and Hatcher.

After 3 innings of play, the Glen had the lead 3-0. That was to be the final score.

The Glen out-hit Erin 8-1. All the players swung well at the plate. Randy VanWyck only fanned 4 of the Glen batters. Robbie Hatcher and Larry Wheeler both pounded 2 good hits each. Wheeler rubbed Erin of a hit by making a spectacular catch above his head.

The Glen fielders stole a few as well. And the infielders only allowed 2 errors throughout the game.

Everyone had a good game, much to Alton's regret.

So the victory gave the Glen Merchants a final 16-9 record tying Alton. But through regular season play, the locals beat Alton by 2 games to 1, thus taking the league title.

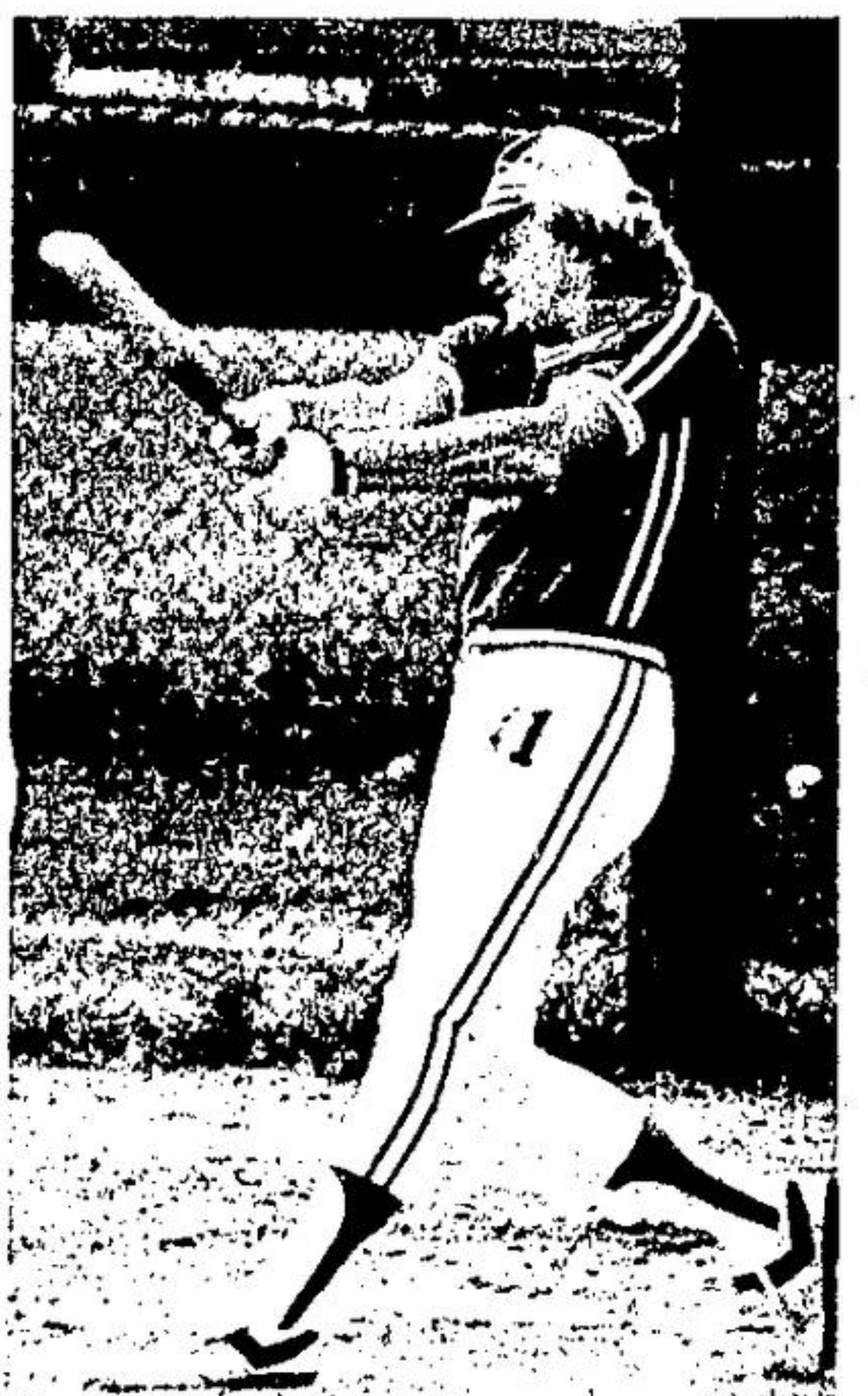
Congratulations to all the players and coaches for a very productful season.
