Mr. Tocher has been a musician since age four and has travelled all across Ontario as a professional singer. In his travels he has seen a lot of pianos that "need rescuing" and decided to save a few during his spare time. He buys old pianos and restores them to their previous tone and beauty. Each piano, depending on the condition it's in, takes about one week to restore from the inside out. Some examples of their workmanship will be on display at their booth this Saturday.

In addition, approximately 35 other exhibitors will be displaying their products that could provide surprises as shoppers wander among the booths. Who knows what one can uncover at a garage sale booth? Or for the do-it-yourselfer, many booths will supply craft materials and the know-how for making crafts. Included

Those with hearty appetites won't be disappointed, since many booths will be offering foods from all over the world, including locally produced fresh fruits and vegetables, kolbasa, pepperoni, salami, pizza, dried fruits and nuts and old-fashioned fudge and popcorn.

To dress up the kids for school can be a heavy drain on the family budget each September, but not if the smart shopper checks out the Leathertown Market. Jeans, T-shirts and tops are standard fare at some booths and bargains are most likely to be found at the display of unclaimed articles from Acton Family Cleaners. Other booths will feature rocking chairs "at rock bottom prices", used bicycles, vacation property in Florida, luggage, knives and military

At 10:30, shoppers will be entertained by the McKenzie-Smith School jazz group, who will keep the toes tapping as they swing through a series of modern dances. More jiggling takes place on-stage at 11 as the Joyce Carpenter Dancers provide an excellent show.

The final presentation of awards and certificates to Acton participants at 11:30 will be followed by the final draw in the series. First prize is a trip for two, valued at \$1,800, to a secret destination.

MPP Julian Reed and his brother Laurie will be providing lunch hour entertainment as they sing and play the banjo. They'll be followed at 1 p.m. by Kent Tocher and Ed McMullen.

To cap off the entertainment schedule, local square dancers will be swinging their partners at 2:30.

The Leathertown Market should be a boon to local merchants who will have a chance to display their merchandise and a welcome change of pace event for area residents.
