they see themselves on T.V. The Geminis won't be the only ones carefully scrutinized by the big screen machine. Coach Switzer plans to film each hockey team in the league just before the Geminis play them; say, one week before. A PROFIT?

Maybe our new Georgetown coach could make a profit on his filming by re-selling the tapes to fellow coaches who want to prove to their players that Big Brother can spot their mistakes better than


