Merchants drop first semi-final game to Hillsburg

But Dean Hancock drew a walk to start off the bottom of the first. Then Les Wilson was "hit with a pitch", leaving two base-runners on (Danny Fields ran for the injured Wilson) with no-one out.

Mike Reynolds also drew a walk to load the bases. Again the pitcher walked Andy Broadbent to score the first Glen run.

Fields as he stole to home. Hillsburgh then pulled their starting pitcher and put in Sunstrom. Sunstrom gave up only two hits, and struck out 12 Glen batters during the remainder of the game.

Then Hillsburgh scored two more on one hit and an error in the top of the sixth to give them a 3-2 lead.

It stayed that way for the remainder of the game.

Jeff Haines pitched well through for the Glen. He struck out 12 also, and gave up five hits, but the lack of hits and a few errors on the Merchants part lost them the game.

Game two was Thursday Sept. 10 in Erin, and game three is back in the Glen, Tuesday, Sept. 15 at 8 p.m.

Two weeks ago, the Glen Men defeated Erin in three games straight to advance to the semi-finals.

Susan's back from Europe

A local resident fared better in her orienteering class competition in Switzerland last week than she did on her return flight back to Canada.

Susan Budge of RRI Terra Cotta was 32 of 72 competitors during the World Orienteering championships, but her plane blew an engine and was diverted to New York, the second year University of Waterloo student said.

The best placing at the World meet for Canada was a 29th finish by one of the competitors, Susan said. The men's orienteering team placed well in finishing 33rd and 36th, she said.

But again the dominating field of Scandinavian competitors were unbeatable. In the women's competition, the Swedes finished first, the Norwegians second and the Swedes third. Norway captured the top three medals in the men's events.

Susan now heads back to school to pursue her Kinesiology degree. Meanwhile she will be teaching Orienteering to a skills camp this week and has plans for starting an Orienteering club in Kitchener-Waterloo area for the coming year.

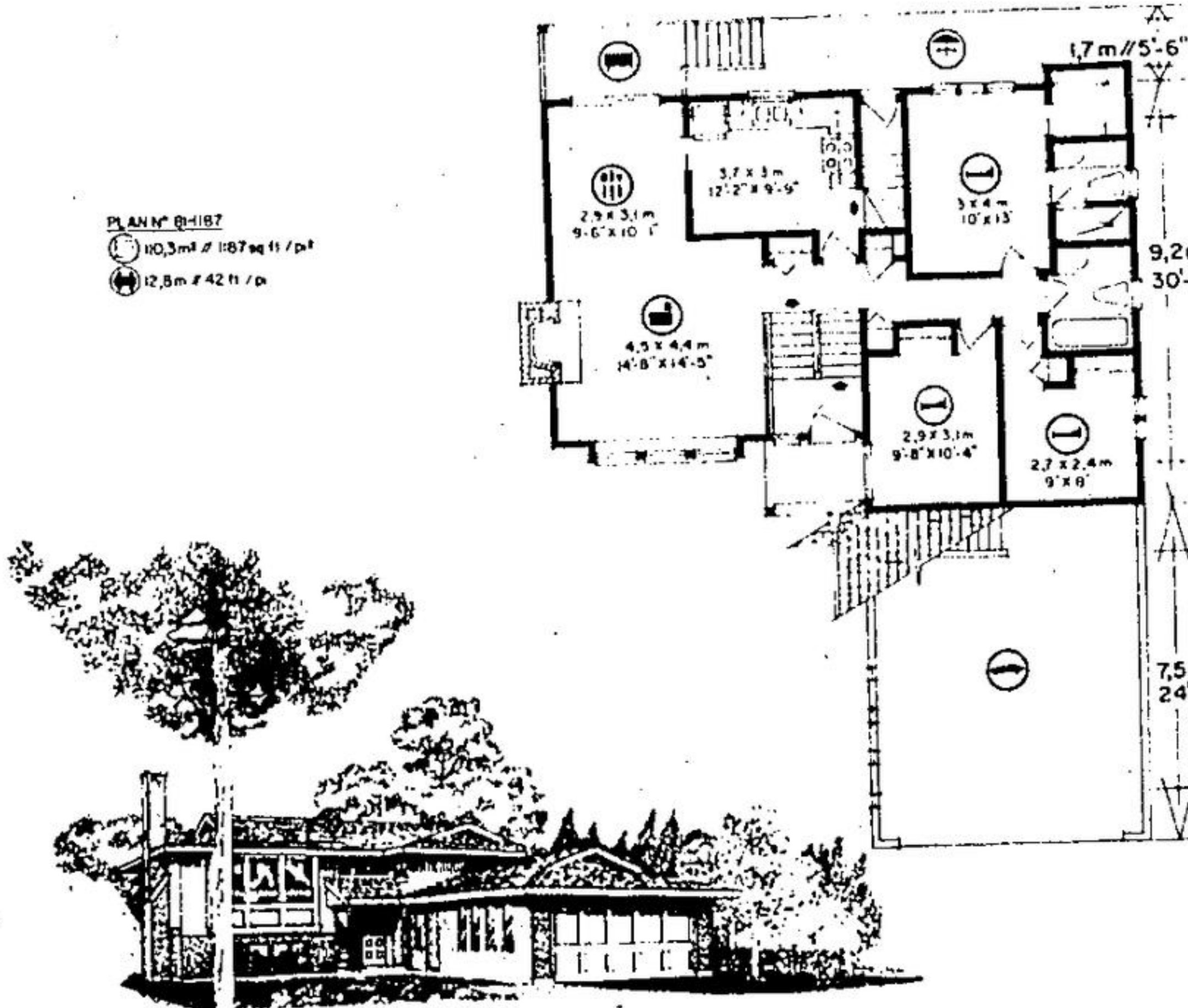

HOME OF THE WEEK



IMPOSING SPLIT ENTRY HOME CAN DOUBLE ITS AREA

Here's an impressive home design which provides abundant space and all of the necessary amenities for present requirements and which is capable of extensive future development to nearly twice the present area. The exterior is finished in vertical channel sliding and brick veneer, and presents a dignified traditional facade which would make a welcome addition to any residential development. The design is ideally suited to the medium frontage residential building lot and provides almost 1,200 square feet of finished floor area, for present use, and nearly as great an area, in potential, for future development. The weather-protected main entry leads into a compact reception foyer which contains twin half-stairways; the left-hand one leading up

to the main living level, the right-hand one leading down to the un-finished lower level. From the reception landing and outerwear storage area, traffic flows naturally left and directly into the large L-shape living-dining room combination. The living room features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace for convivial "at-homes" and a large, front-facing "box-bay" window, for view and natural light. The dining room features a sliding glass walk-through leading onto a private balcony. The spacious L-shape kitchen-dinette area features a step-saving work triangle and abundant cupboard storage. This area may be completely isolated from the main living area, for privacy and hygiene. From the dinette, a winding stairway leads down to the rear exit.

All three bedrooms are positioned to the right of the floor plan, and well away from the main entertaining area for freedom from disturbance. Each has ample closet storage and good exposure for view and natural light. The rear-facing master bedroom features a full walk-in closet and a three-piece ensuite bath with shower, both of which are concealed behind space-saving pocket doors. The un-finished lower level has roughed-in plumbing and a roughed-in masonry fireplace as the basis of the future development of additional living accommodations and/or recreational facilities. Plans for design No. 81-1187 may be purchased either by the single set, at a cost of \$125.00 for the first set and \$25.00 for each additional set, or by the package. A five-set plan package, including the first set, is economically priced at \$180.00 and an eight-set package, also including the first set, is only \$220.00.
