Local football fans haven't yet seen the best games of the season because the Glen Merchants are still in town.

Representing Glen Williams in the highly competitive Intercounty football league, the Glen Men finished the season on top of the league, bottling in their characteristic gutsy fashion, right to the end to take the league championship.

They now seem destined to reflect their regular season's performance as they won against Hillsburgh 2-0 to tie the best three of five series at home last Tuesday night.

The final and deciding game of the semi-final series begins Sunday afternoon at the Glen ballpark at 2 p.m. For a reason

other than supporting our local Intercounty entry, fans should watch this game to see one of the best football games of the season.

FAN SUPPORT
The Glen team have been known to play some excellent exciting ball in playoff action and no one's sure to be disappointed after watching the Merchants face Hillsburgh.

Those fearing the cold autumn nights have no excuse in travelling down to the Glen for the last game of the semi-finals. Fan support could be the deciding factor in a series that has been very close.

Hillsburgh started off strong by winning the first two games but the Glen came back

MEMORABLE
One of the most memorable games for the team was two years ago in the first round of playoffs against the Hespeler Beehives. In a game that was the third and deciding game of the best two of three series, Jeff Haines pitched for 29 innings in a losing effort.

The Bee Hives and the Glen were tied 0-0 for 28 straight innings until the Bee Hives broke loose for three runs in the top of

the 29th inning. The game started at 8 p.m. but did not finish until 1:30 p.m.

Last season the Merchants finished the regular league standings in sixth spot, but went on in the playoffs to defeat Orangeville in the fifth game 1-0 in a best of three of five series. Orangeville were the defending champions from last season.

In the quarter-finals against Ferguson, the Glen also came out on top, defeating their opponents in three straight games. Against Hespeler in the finals the Bee Hives were the stronger team as they overpowered the locals four games to one.
