This year's fair, celebrating its 135th anniversary, opens tonight (Friday) at 7 p.m. and when it closes about 36 hours later there's little doubt that participants will go home gorged on the variety and pace of activity.

A parade around the track will officially open the fair's program. Special guests have been invited to the anniversary kick-off, including the famed Ontario Provincial Police "Golden Helmets", a precision team of police motorcyclists.

Register at 9:30 a.m. for the pet show. Here too, there are a variety of unusual classes, including the saddest looking dog and the pet that best resembles the president of the fall fair. Hardly flattering, but the idea behind the show is to strive for the zaniest, so bring out your pet mongoose if you feel it has a chance to win something.
