Actario's return delayed until Dec. 5

The first Actario draw in the second year-long series has been set back to Dec. 5 from Oct. 3, Actario organizers announced.

Ja ke Kuiken said it isn't a matter of getting positive response from people contact-

ed about buying a second year's ticket; it's a matter of the service clubs not getting out and contacting ticket holders from last year.

"Last year we went out and talked to the service clubs and got them all enthused on selling the tickets," he said.

"This year we expected the clubs would just automatically go to it and do the job and it didn't happen."

Mr. Kuiken said so far only 100 tickets have been sold and 400 are necessary to cover the expenses of operating the

year-long lottery. Although organizers expect sufficient sales will be made in the next month to enable the draw to continue they are delaying the start by two months just to be sure.

Sales have picked up dramatically in the past week with about 70 of the 100 tickets being turned in since Acton Fall Fair weekend.

Only 1,000 tickets are available for the weekly draws and the tickets can be purchased for \$100 cash or with \$25 cash and three post-dated cheques to cover the balance. Although

times are hard, it appears that ticket purchasers are generally laying down the cash instead of opting for the installment plan, he said.

When directly contacted by Actario organizers about purchasing a ticket again this

year only a very few of last year's ticket holders haven't purchased a 1981 ticket. This leads him to believe sales should equal last year if the ticket sellers just get to work and call their customers from last year.

Actario was established as a weekly draw in September, 1980, to raise funds for the restoration of Acton's old town hall. This year a larger percentage of the funds raised were to be donated to the service clubs who sold the tickets.

Actario won't officially begin its second year of weekly draws until Dec. 5 but ticket holders can look forward to a series of early bird draws in the meantime.

Actario chairman Ted Tyler said the committee

held its first early bird draw last week and presented the winner with a real bird; a real live turkey just in time for Thanksgiving, that is.

This Saturday (Oct. 10) Actario will be passing out free children's tickets to an Oct. 18 Acton Sabres hockey game in Milton.

Mr. Tyler said 24 tickets for youngsters under the age of 16 will be available at 11:30 a.m. from either Halton Hills Furniture Store or the Tyler Travel Agency. Tickets will only be given out to parents on a first-come, first-serve, basis, said Mr. Tyler.

A free bus will be provided to transport the ticket holders to and from the game. The boarding point will be the Halton Hills Furniture Store.

These are only two of a whole series of events Actario members have planned to spark a little interest, said Mr. Tyler, and remind potential ticket-holders that they can't participate if they haven't got a ticket.

The Actario draw was to have begun its second year today but poor ticket sales postponed it until December.

The North Halton Association for the Mentally Retarded and a special committee it has formed will operate a toy lending library at the new Halton Hills library-cultural centre this fall. Committee chairman Audrey Hillman says toys are being collected and an operating manual prepared for a tentative Oct. 30 opening.
