Nancy Mustard was the first place finisher of the Year 8 girls division with a

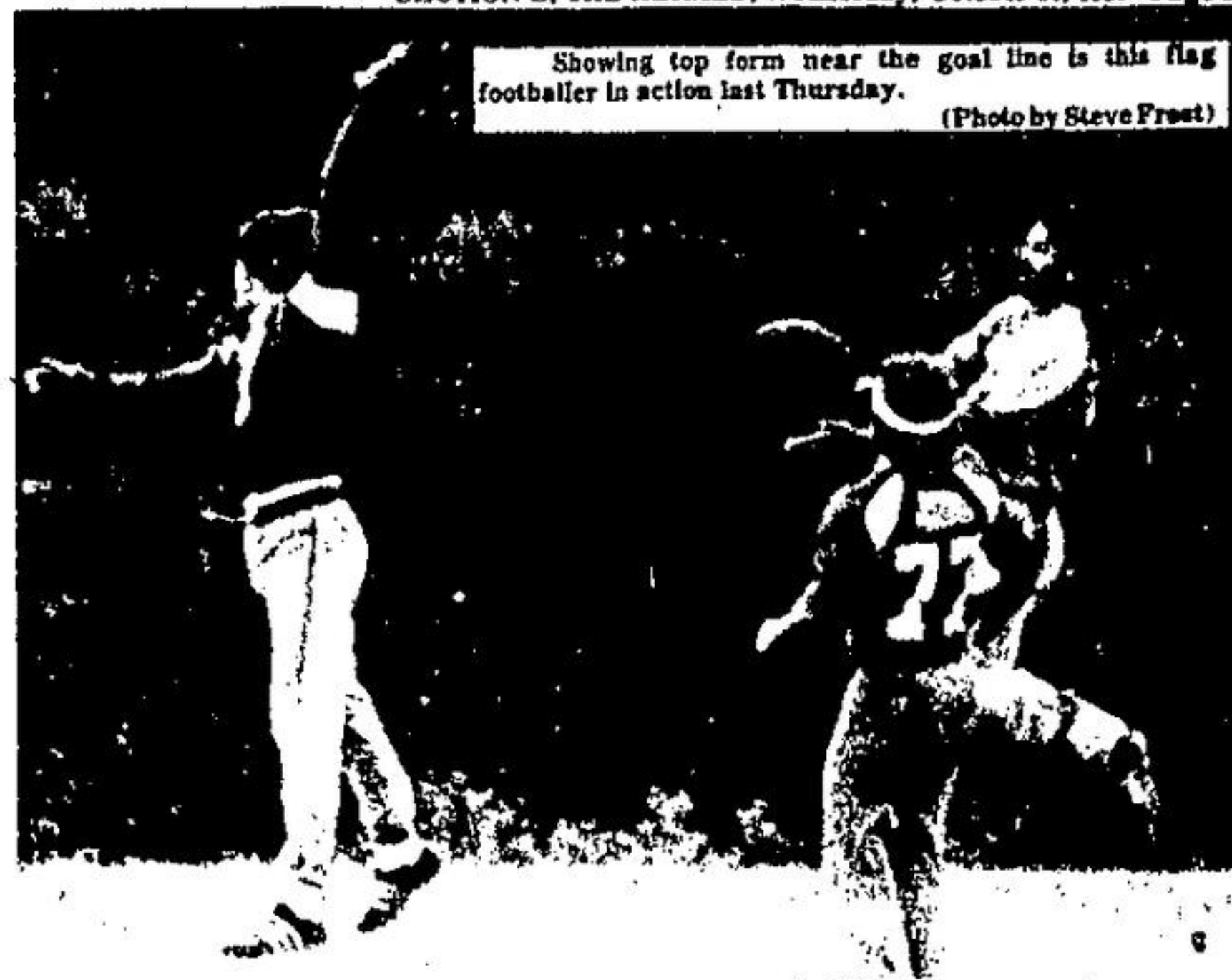
time of 4:44.55 for her House 4 team.

This past Wednesday, 13 local public schools competed in the second annual Family of Schools cross-country meet held at Joseph Gibbons Public School in Moore Park.

Centennial won two of the five divisions by claiming the combined girls' and boys' bantam and junior categories.

Centennial easily won the bantam division scoring 59 points. They had 38 points in the junior division, 44 points ahead of second place Stewarttown. McKenale Smith was third with 143 points.

Stewarttown also won two of the five divisions by claiming the combined girls' and boys' intermediate and senior divisions. The teams win of 35 points in the intermediate category was only half of second place Centennial's 70 points.

This Stewarttown combined intermediate team had the lowest (best) total of the five divisions at the meet.

Stewarttown's winning senior team finished with 36 points; 10 points ahead of Centennial in second place.

The winner of the atom division (the youngest of the

five divisions) was Joseph Gibbons scoring 72 points. George Kennedy was close behind in second place with 74 points.

Of the ten teams that raced (five divisions of girls and boys) the team with the lowest score was Stewarttown's intermediate girls team. This awesome team

led by Amy Powers in first place and sister Annie in second finished with a staggering low score of 12 points.
