Ex-councillor urges attention to building's fate 'Many uses for old stone school'

As a result of a letter from a former Acton councillor, town council asked its staff to look into the future of Acton's Old Stone school once it ceases to serve as St. Joseph's separate school next year.
G.W. (Pat) McKenzie, former Ward 1 councillor and long time principal of Acton's Robert Little public school which shares its grounds with the stone school, asked council to make inquiries of the school's fate through the Halton board of education.
The stone school is a separate building containing five classrooms, an office, two washrooms, a gas furnace, three exits including a second floor fire escape and possessing excellent parking facilities.
The institution is structurally sound and in good repair but would be virtually impossible to separate from Robert Little school and the Acton Library for sale at public auction, he notes.

Mr. McKenzie suggested a day care centre, the museum for Leithertown and senior citizens facilities as possible uses for the site and said he believes it should be put to some useful purpose at no additional cost to the taxpayers other than operating expenses.
Town council is the proper body to negotiate with the Halton board of education, he said, and if council acts now "an excellent facility for community purposes" could be available by September, 1982.
The building is owned by the Halton board of education and rented to the Halton separate school board for the remainder

of the 1981-82 school year. The separate school board will be constructing a new school during 1982 and when St. Joseph's students move the building will be empty. Unused schools are offered to government bodies first, then put up for public auction.

A large family room/TV lounge is sunken two risers from the dinette area, from which it is separated via optional spindle screen wall. The family room features a raised-hearth masonry fireplace and a rear exit door.
