Local businesses 'hire' GDHS marketing

Local businesses are participating in a new Georgetown and District High School marketing program.

Worth two credits, the course involves Grade 11 and 12 students in marketing theory, as well as gets them out into the business world for at least ten hours a week.

Course instructor Phil Peden explained that students take their regular classes and also spend about two hours per day each four-month semester at a retail store learning aspects of the business. While at the

store, students help the manager maintain inventory and take care of customer accounts.

"The business community of Georgetown has been very receptive to the program," Mr. Peden said. "There are currently 12 businesses involved with the course: the Royal Bank, North Halton ports, the Carpet Barn, Zellers, Jackies' (Clothing), Canadian Tire, Silver's, the local Co-op outlet, Home Hardware, Halton Camera Exchange and Neil's Music Centre."

In addition to the retailers, Vickers and Benson Advertising of Toronto is also participating in the program, and a number of other local businesses have expressed an interest in joining next year.

"The school sees this as a valuable experience both for the student and business," Mr. Peden said, applauding the "positive attitudes" businesses have shown for the students' potential.

"We're pleased with the program's beginnings and we look forward to its growth next year," he said.
