Barber-Johnson dance pair sixth at Skate Canada competition

Kris Barber of Glen Williams and partner Kelly Johnson of Willowdale improved their showing from their St. Ivel performance three weeks ago as they skated to a sixth place finish in the Skate Canada International Figure Skating competition last weekend.

The dance pair were the top Canadian pair to finish and according to Barber, the duo did very well, to the point where they felt they could have been the top contenders at the competition. However, a slow start during the competition forced the dance team to play catch-up which isn't easy to do under the judging system.

Although Kris said he and Kelly couldn't have skated much better, he admitted they will have to work harder at their compulsories which held them down in the competition. He and Kelly skated more consistently than they did three weeks ago at St. Ivel, he says.

Overall, the Canadian team were one point out of first place, which eventually went to the American team.

In an article featured in the Globe and Mail last Saturday which had a picture of the Barber-Johnson team, a Canadian skating coach downgraded the system of judging by Canadian judges which are not consistent with European methods. Bernard Ford said in the Globe article that skating ability is overlooked by Canadian judges and that everyone gets carried away with choreography and movements of the upper body.

When interviewed last Monday night Barber said that he was glad someone finally spoke out against the Canadian method of judging. He feels that a winning dance pair should try and reach a happy medium in their skating routine.

Barber and Johnson will be off to Japan Nov. 22 for their next international skating event and the duo should do well because there is no compulsory events.

At the end of January the dance pair will enter the Canadian championships to which they have an automatic entry.

Exhibition hockey for local Major Atoms

Despite being outshot 30-13 by a team that skated hard and played very well positionally, the locals dropped the game by a 5-4 score.

Stuart Vogt scored his first goal of the season on the very first shot on net. He slid the puck along the ice to the corner at 9:41 of the opening frame. At 6:24 and 1:24 Hamilton replied to take the lead.

At 8:31 of the middle frame the hosts popped another one in on a goal mouth scramble. Georgetown came on strong as Brent Presswood netted an unassisted backhander at 7:11 and Adam Bennett scored the equalizer on a short-handed effort at 3:18.

The Huskies roared back with two quick tallies at 10:30 and 10:16 of the final frame. Andrew Hoddinott cut their lead to only one goal at 7:24. Georgetown was pressing for a tie late in the game but with 1:56 left the game was called due to curfew.

Assisting the locals' marksmen were Kevin Roe, Chris McCarthy, Alan Giray and Doug Kent.

Back in league play on October 29 at Memorial Arena, the Major Atoms hosted the Brampton squad and downed them 5-2.

Jeremy Fekke got things started for the locals when he flipped the puck past the visitors' goalie at 8:08.

He was assisted by Alan Giray and Doug McDermol. Brampton knotted the score less than a minute later but at 5:40 Doug Kent, from Kevin Roe, connected from out in front.

At 9:33 of the second period Brent Presswood, unassisted surprised the Brampton netminder with a high shot to the corner from just inside the blue line.

The visitors pulled to within one at 3:23 when a man was left uncovered in front of the net.

Early in the third Travis Gardner, assisted by Chris McCarthy, netted one on a goalmouth scramble. And-

rew Hoddinott, from Doug Kent, wrapped up the scoring for the locals at 2:37.

Georgetown outshot their visitors by a 31-12 margin.
