The senior girls' basketball team rounded out their season by winning the Redman Invitational basketball tournament, losing the Halton quarter-final game to Queen Elizabeth Park and competing in the Cougar Invitational tournament last weekend.

Thursday night the seniors lost by a very close 51-49 score to Q. E. Park in what was described by coach Pearce as a valiant effort. The play throughout the game was considered fast and competitive.

Two weekends ago, the Rebels won three straight games to win the Acton Redman tournament. The initial game set the pace for the Georgetown domination as they defeated Central Wellington by a score of 28-14, which advanced them to the semi-final game against Oakville Trafalgar.

Earlier in the season, the seniors were defeated by O. T. by one mere point, but "by showing its true colors" beat them by a score of 45-30 in Acton.

In the final game of the tourney the Rebels were pitted against the Acton Redmen. Both teams showed great skill and improvement right until the end of the game, which ended with Georgetown winning 41-39.

Both coaches Pearce and Smye were proud of the high level of basketball skill shown by all team members.

In a high calibre tournament held at M. M. Robinson the Rebels lost two games straight. The first game was lost by a score of 75-45 to Branford and the second was lost to Dundas Parkside by a score of 54-48.

The all-star team judged at the end of the tournament contained Rebel Michelle Miehms for outstanding play.

The coaches said that the whole season saw a tremendous improvement in skills and the win of the Acton tournament could be considered an historical event.

They are proud and appreciative of the hard work and effort put forth by all team members, notably Kim Thompson, Cindy Pettibone, Michelle Miehms, Jenny Smith, Cathy Dobson, Dobson, Barb McKeeman, Suzanne Abrey, Lisa Allen and Jane Cartwright.

"We didn't have anybody to put the puck in the net," complained Darcy about a team which scored just one more goal than last-place Midland. Sunoco's top scorer, Jim McKinnon, did not even make the league's top 10. He'll be returning this year to help the offence, as will brother Paul McKinnon.

In a search for offence, Sunoco have signed two ex-juniors products in Owen Sound's Pete McDermott and Sudbury's Ron Dugas.

"McDermott's an exceptional hockey player," lauds Darcy.

Sunoco were struck a blow when goalie Bob Toffen, one of the league's best, retired at the end of last season and back-up Paul McLaren returned to the University of Western Ontario.

To fill the void, Sunoco brought goaltender Dave Rosner from Owen Sound. He lives just outside of the Port but went east when he felt he couldn't make Sunoco last season.

Other returnees are Steve Pette, Jim Stark, Doug Mitchell and Cam Hendry.

"It's a little too early for us to tell how we're doing," said Darcy, "and I don't know what we'll have up there Friday night (for the league opener in Orillia). I'll take us another two or three weeks to get it together."
