# CAS offers child abuse talks

The Halton Children's Aid Society is sponsoring a Trainer's Workshop on Child Abuse to be taught by Dr. Donna Lero, a professor at the University of Guelph and co-author of the Lero Child Abuse Module. The workshop will consist of six sessions beginning today (Wednesday).

The purpose of this workshop is to train people within the service and education systems to provide early

detection and early intervention in child abuse. These people, in turn, will train other professionals in the community to increase the adequacy of the awareness of child abuse.

Dr. Lero has been a professor in the Department of Family Studies at the University of Guelph since 1974. In 1975, the University pro-school was notified by the CAS that one of the children enrolled in their program was an abuse victim. It was then that Dr. Lero realized that many professionals working in the field of early childhood education

didn't recognize child abuse and often, when it was reported to them, didn't know how to handle the case. At this time, she became involved in the Ministry seminars on child abuse and found that they did not meet the professionals' informational needs regarding the identification and referral of suspected child abuse cases.

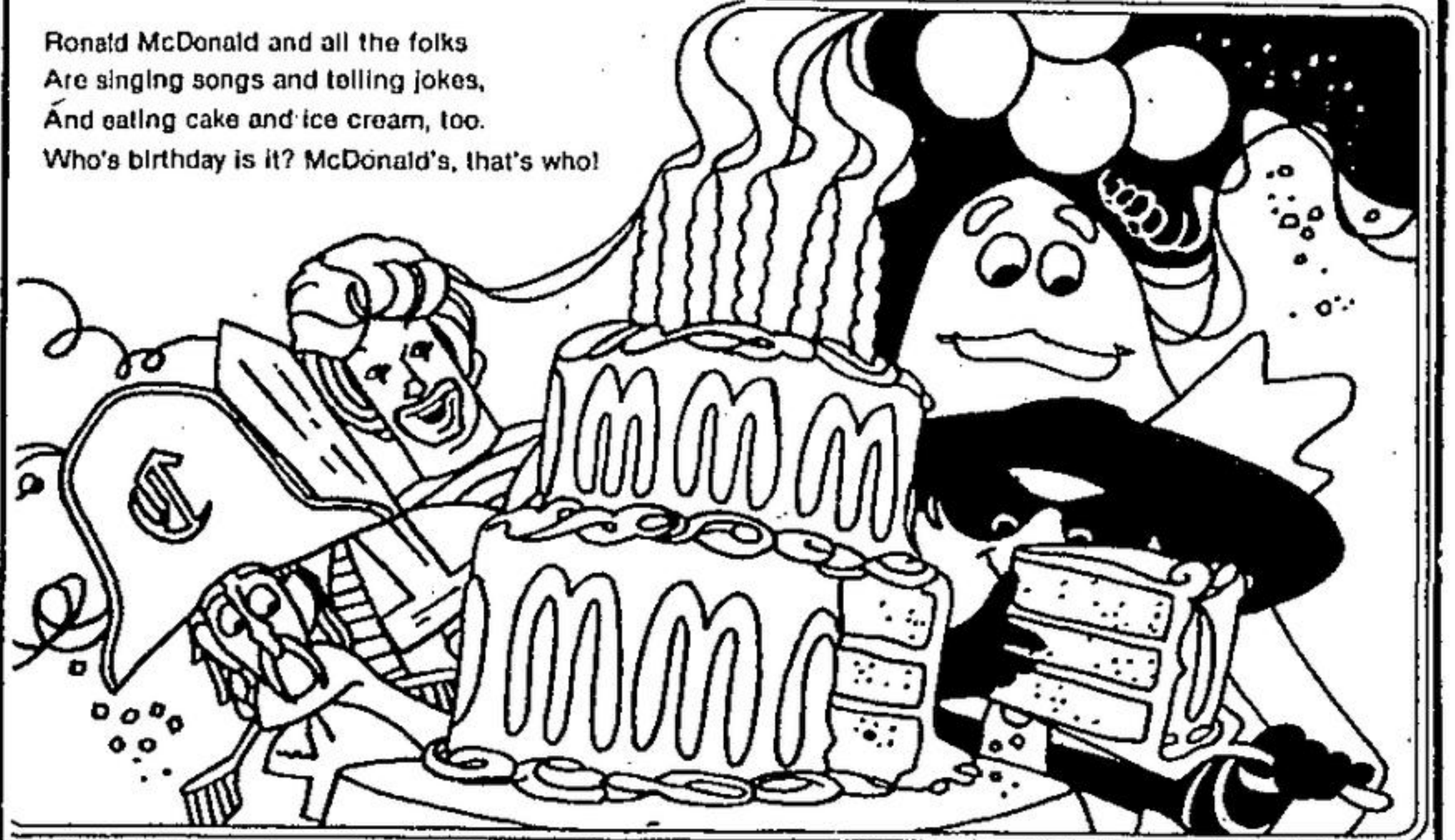
In 1977 and 1978, Dr. Lero and Susan de Rijke-Lellis, M.S., did a survey of early childhood educators.

Dr. Lero began developing a curriculum for university

students, and was then asked by the Ministry to expand it to relate to professionals already in the field. The Child Abuse Module took two years to develop and has a generic core for use by any professionals who may have contact with victims of child abuse, with individual units for social service professionals, early childhood educators, mental retardation counselors, and child care workers. The manual was field-tested at Conestoga College and is now in use at virtually all community colleges across Ontario.
