## Hint: replace weak batteries

Cold winter weather will soon be upon us so it's a good time now to start preparing for winter driving. Winter weather conditions present some special difficulties for drivers and their cars. The Hamilton Automobile Club suggests you plan now for getting yourself and your car ready for driving in cold, snowy weather.

PREPARE YOUR CAR To prepare your car for winter driving get a tuneup now. Check or have the mechanic check the following

Electrical System - recharge or replace weak batteries; have your voltage regulator checked; check all of your car's lights for proper operation; check the ignition system for damaged wires. cracked distributor cap, or worn spark plugs.

2. Brake System - to avoid skids you need equal braking on all four surfaces; brakes should be checked and adjusted for equal braking.

3. Tires - make certain your tires are in good condition; snow tires are recommended.

4. Exhaust System - check for leaks to reduce the chances of carbon monoxide poisoning; if your car is stuck in the snow, clear the area around the tail pipe and slightly open a window.

Heating and Cooling System - check your radiator for leaks and cracks, hoses too; add a sufficient amount of antifreeze; test your heater and defroster for proper opera-

Windshield Wipers and Washer - check wipers for proper functioning, replace worn blades; fill your washer bottle with antifreeze washer

Winter Driving Klt carry the following items in your car in case of an emergency: tire chains, small snow shovel, extra clothing, traction mats, ice scraper, booster cables, warning devices (flares or triangles), small bag of abrasive material (sand, salt, or kitty litter), snow brush, flashlight, blanket, candle and matches.

PREPARE YOURSELF Approach winter driving with the right frame of mind always drive at a speed that matches the prevailing visibility, traffic and road conditions. To see and be seen by others requires you to clean all of the snow and ice from the entire car - hood, roof, trunk, lights, and windows. Try to avoid driving when the visibility is poor, but if you must, keep your speed low, headlights on low beam, and pull off to a safe spot as soon as possible. Use sunglasses to combat glare off the snow, and as the law states

wear your seatbelt. ADDITIONAL HAC HINTS - Avold driving while fatigu-

- Never warm up a vehicle in an enclosed area, such as a - Make certain your tires are properly inflated.

- Never mix radial tires with other tire types. - Keep your gas tank at least

half full to avoid gas line - If possible, avoid using your parking brake in cold, slushy

- When you have to slow or stop pump your brakes. This helps to maintain steering and

- "Easy does it" when accelerating, turning, or braking. Plan your maneuvers well in advance and do them smooth-

Watch for overpasses, underpasses, and shady spots that freeze first and melt last. - If you go into a skid don't panic. Take your foot off the gas and steer in the direction the rear of the car is sliding. - Straighten out the wheel

when you feel the skid correct itself. - It takes longer to stop on ice and snow than it does on dry pavement. Drecrease your speed and increase your following distance.




