He goes on to say that disclosure of information would jeopardize the ability to find a buyer for another block of shares...Are the facts so bad that their disclosure would deter a potential investor? How come Ontario purchased presumably knowing these

facts:" Robert Nixon commented on the Minister's statement that it was not customary for a compendium to be provided for statements of policy, saying "Your readers should know precisely what the Standing Orders of the Legislature require: Rule 26 (c) states 'After any policy statement, the Minister shall table a compendium of background information'

"Surely, this is perfectly clear. To argue that the Premier's statement announcing the purchase of the shares of Suncor was not a policy statement is ridiculous, and to argue whether a time limit for the tabling of the compendium is a part of the rule is irrelevant because the rule simply says that the compendium shall be tabled...Mr. Welch protests too much that his position is misrepresented. He should certainly take the necessary steps to see that the matter is referred to a standing committee and that the financial advisers from the Government and from McLeod, Young, Weir and Price Waterhouse are available to respond in a public forum."

ASTRA Liberal Leader Stuart Smith has once again raised the question of the investors who lost so much money in the Astra Trust Re-Mor collapses, saying these people will continue to suffer until the provincial government resolves the "flasco". He cited the case of a Grimsby man who will probably lose his home because of his investment. This man intended to invest \$30,000 in the federallychartered Astra, but the money was channeled into its sister company Re-Mor. When he wanted to withdraw his money, he was told he couldn't, but Astra loaned him \$27,000 - an amount for which the company is now sulng him. Smith asked "Will the government explain how it can happen that people who are owed money by the Astra bunch should also be sued by them for money owed to Astra?"
