Winter season good for fish on Temagami

SPLAKE season is open, and there are apparently lots of fish around the bay at Owen Sound.

Some open water fishing is available, with only the winds of the area to stop fishermen heading out too far. That and the cold in the boat, even with a heater on board. The Splake, a cross between a speckled trout and a lake trout, is abundant and easily taken by bait fishermen using minnows and some times a spawn sack. When ice forms on the bays, there will be a hot fishery as the fish can often be seen below the ice, along with Rainbow trout, and minnows are still the order of the day, but small spoons and spinners take a lot of these two fine fish.

Personally I think you will have to wait some time for ice fishing as it is likely going to be one of those years when the ice is slow in forming.

When it does though, the ice fishing on lakes such as Simcoe will be excellent. Temagami has produced well so far this year with a reported 7,219 lake trout for a substantial increase.

If the winter season is as good, it will be worth the run

Grouse hunting runs until Jan. 15, 1982 along with rabbits and hares that close Feb. 29. This includes cottontail, European hare or jackrabbit, and varying hare or snowshoe.

Squirrel closes Dec. 15 as does pheasant, and raccoon closes Feb. 28. Fox and the wolf family which includes coyotes has no closed season but all these dates are in our area.

For others read the summary of the regulations. Here is a quote from those regulations: "the pelts of wolf, coyote, fox, raccoon, skunk and weasel, taken on a hunting licence, must be stamped by an officer before being offered for sale or sent to a tanner or taxidermist, and royalty must be paid on all fox and raccoon before they can be accepted by a tanner or taxidermist as prescribed in the regulations."

The well known and enjoyed Darlington Waterfowl Day is a thing of the past. The Ontario Federation of Anglers and Hunters in conjunction with the Ontario Out of Doors magazine will provide a consumer outdoor show in Toronto the weekend of Sept. 10, 11 and 12, 1982.
