Have you registered for the Y Winter Programs yet? The Georgetown Y is now accepting registrations for all Winter Programs. Also, an evening registration will be held next Tuesday (Dec. 15) from 8 to 9 p.m. at 89 Mountainview Rd. S.

The Y is introducing some new Winter Programs that will begin in January. A ten-week Stained Glass Course will be held Tuesdays from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. beginning Jan. 12. You will have the opportunity to learn copper foil and lead came techniques, which will be used to create various stained glass creations, from window panels to three dimensional objects.

The Y will also be offering a Chess Program, for those who are beginners and for those who wish to improve their current playing ability. Chess will be held on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon. Why not join the Y to learn the fine art of "string" and "log cabin" quilting over a ten-week period. Kitchen accessories, cushions, bags and small quilt projects will be completed. The quilting program will be held Thursdays from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m., at the Y. Babysitting will be available at a nominal fee. Kindercooking has return-

ed for 3 to 5 year-olds once again. Beginning Jan. 27, your child will be introduced to simple recipes that are



geared to good nutrition and will be fun to make. Playschool, Kinderfun, French Playschool, Artful Toddler, Parent and Tot Gym, Tiny Tumblers Gym, Kinder-games and Rhythmics are also returning for preschoolers.

The Y will be offering programs for children and teens as well. An eight-week Babysitter's Training Course, a Girl's Self-Improvement Course for 11 to 13 year olds, Gymnastics for Boys and Girls, Tae Kwon Do, Ceramics, Judo, and Youth Basketball will all be offered.

All five to 12-year olds are encouraged to become involved in the Y's Christmas Holiday Happenings Dec. 23, 28, 29 and 30. The Y has planned various activities such as trips to the Science Centre, Ontario Place, a visit by a magician, bowling, swimming, watching a ballet performance at Harbourfront, games, movies and crafts.

The Georgetown Y's School of Dance will continue with ballet classes Tuesdays and Wednesdays. Kinder, Pre-Primary and Primary

Ballet will be taught by Liz Chalmers at the Y Tuesday afternoon. The Wednesday classes will include Primary, Grade II, and Grade III, Grade IV and Adult Ballet and will be taught by Sandra Williams at Sacre Couer. Y Ballet classes begin Jan. 5 and 6.

A variety of health and recreation programs, such as Aerobics I and II, Be Fit, Sport and Swim, Y's One Senior Fitness, Yoga, Cross Country Skiing, Badminton, "In the Mood" Ballroom Dancing will be offered. The "Y" will be introducing an Aerobics II program Tuesday afternoon and evening and Thursday evening for those who are interested in a more intense fitness program.

Stained glass, quilting, and chess as well as Calligraphy I and II, Cutting Your Child's Hair, Astrology for fun and Spanish will be offered. Calligraphy I will be held Mondays from 7 to 8:30 p.m. and Calligraphy II will be held Wednesdays from 7 to 8:30 p.m. and both will be held at Harrison Public School.

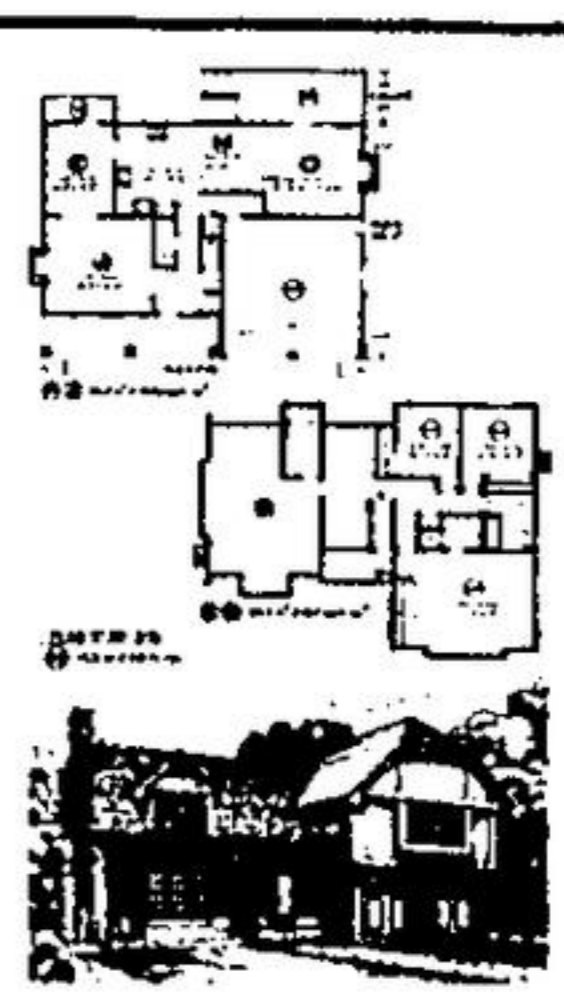

For greater privacy, the dining room could be separated from the kitchen-dinette via pocket door or saloon-style swinging doors.

All three existent bedrooms are positioned on the second level, accessible via stairway from the main entrance foyer. Each has generous closet storage facilities and good exposure for view and natural light. The large master bedroom possesses full-width closets and a three piece ensuite bathroom with shower.

A large un-finished area is positioned to the left of the upper level floor plan. It possesses a charming dormer alcove and protruding boxy window. This area could be developed as the fourth and master bedroom, with a private three-piece bathroom as illustrated, or as a lounge-study-library for the business-oriented family which has children of student age.

The full basement enables future development of additional accommodations and/or recreational facilities, as well as providing generous storage area.
