talk on farming in New Zealand.

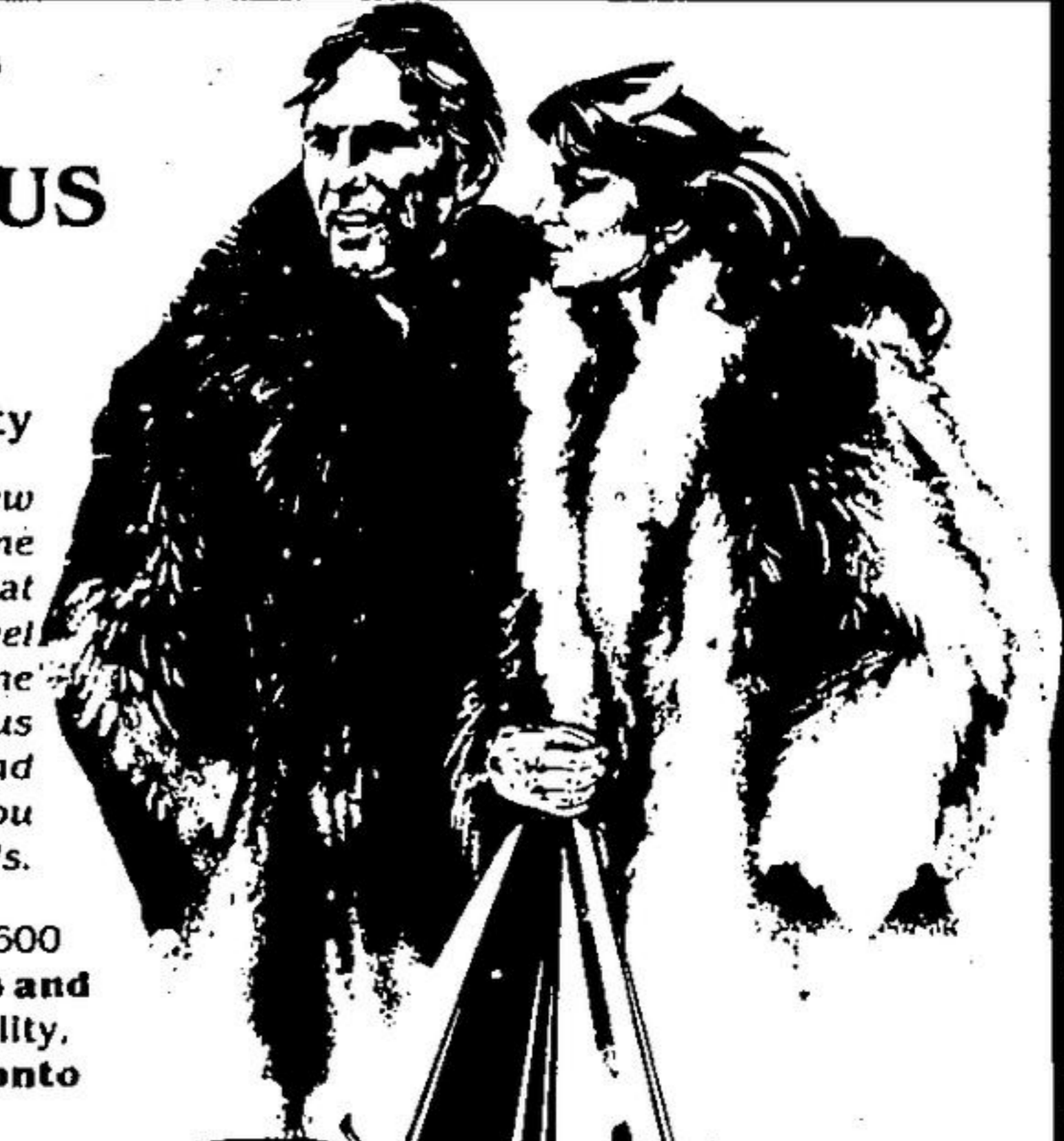
